North Elmham Parish Council Meeting

1st April, 2020 (via Zoom)

The following information is taken from the official PC minutes which are issued by the Clerk once ratified by councillors at the subsequent meeting. The full official minutes can be viewed in the Post Office and on the community website, once approved.

Councillors present by logging in were: Mrs. J. Borgnis (Chairman), Mr. M. Phillips, Miss A. Ferris, Mr. T. Fitzalan Howard, Mr. P. Grainger, Mr. J. Labouchere, Mr. M. Rayner, Mr. C. Smith and Dr. P. Wade-Martins

Also in Attendance: Mr. K. Webb (Clerk)

Land Management Matters

Village Green: The Play Area has been securely closed and, in the current coronavirus crisis, is not to be used. Mr. Smith is to take charge of looking after the bins.

Cathedral Ruins: Advice is awaited from English Heritage as to how the ruins are to be managed. They say that their own workforce is continuing grounds' maintenance, but it is not clear as to whether we should continue ourselves. Mr. Duffield will not be asked to work until precise guidance is received. In the meantime, the gates are being left open.

Prince William Wood: Mr. Darby is proceeding with the fence as there is little likelihood of him coming into contact with anyone else whilst doing this work.

Street Lights: The branches of the tree near light number 18, (opposite the hall in Eastgate Street), are to be lopped.

Highway Matters

The Eastgate Street parking scheme is due to start on 6th April but it is not certain, at this stage, whether it is going ahead. The residents of the street should be notified by the County Council if it is to be closed and it appears they have not been told anything, other than via Elmham News. Dr. Wade-Martins will advise them of the situation as soon as we hear. The main street has been well swept by Breckland but there remains a problem with some debris blocking a drain near the buildout.

Correspondence

A letter had been received from a parishioner offering to buy some parish land near the church. It was unanimously agreed that no decision could be taken on this matter until members have had the chance to fully debate and discuss it at a properly constituted open meeting of the Parish Council. The Chairman will write to the person involved confirming the procedure to be followed.

Skateboard Area

Following the request for an improvement to the skateboard area made at the last meeting, a confirmatory letter had been received. Subsequently, members were disappointed to note that a considerable amount of litter had been left in this area with some also thrown over the wall on to neighbouring farmland. Mr. Smith is to liaise with the young people who wrote the original letter to advise them that the users of the skateboard park need to be more conscientious before the Parish Council can consider supporting them actively.

Coronavirus Crisis

It is the intention to hold the May meetings using an enhanced Zoom facility. A team of volunteers has been formed to help parishioners and Elmham News continues to play an important part.

Dear Editors

Having just read the parish meeting report in the May issue, concerning the build out on Holt Road, our observations are quite different.

We live adjacent to the 'build out' or 'chicane' as we know it, and although some cars coming from the Dereham direction, are forced to stop, many others accelerate on the approach to the chicane in order to avoid having to yield to oncoming traffic, sometimes causing a near collision if the oncoming vehicle doesn't slow down. Then on other occasions we see vehicles driving out of the village towards Dereham at high speed as they have no reason to slow down.

Additionally, we had a policeman knocking on our door last week to ask if we were aware of a hit and run incident, whereby a motorist knocked a cyclist off his bike on the chicane and then sped away from the scene.

We intend this as constructive feedback based purely on our observations given that we live in such close proximity.



Spring on the Allotments

This is a strange time for all of us, being in a Covid-19 lockdown situation. Fortunately many of us have good size gardens so we can get out in the fresh air. I expect many gardens look wonderful this spring.

Much is the same on the allotments. Normally in the early spring people rush home from work and try to grab a few hours with a fork and spade before sowing their seeds in between the April showers.

But this year many allotment holders have more time on their hands and the weather has been sunny warm and dry. Plots are being tidied up and early sowing have pushed their way into the sunlight helped on by copious amounts of water applied by watering cans.

There is a really good camaraderie amongst the allotment holders, albeit shouted across the plots therefore maintaining a "social distance" of about 40 meters. There is always plenty of help and advice travelling across from other plots and a seed swap has been instigated as some members have not been able

to access supplies. Other holders have taken on the cutting of the grass on the paths and car parking areas while the few vacant plots have been cut back. One kindly person actually rotavated my plot for us, as I am still recovering from a fractured leg. That was a great help and many thanks go to all those that have volunteered to carry out those extra tasks.

Keeping the weeds down is a major job as the good growing condition is as good for weeds as it is for vegetables. And then there's the deer, rabbits, mice and moles to contend with. Trying to keep them of the plot is a real challenge. But after several weeks of work the fruits of our labours can start to be seen and tasted. After clearing the ground of the last overwintering crops such as leek, carrots and broccoli, the new season rhubarb and asparagus is available as well as various salad leaves. The potatoes are just about to flower, but then it's a panic cover-up job to protect them against the late May frosts. The crops are looking good. Let's hope the good start continues.

This month's notes are being written during the 75th VE celebration, some of you may realise that our own club is celebrating its 90th Annual Garden Show this year, a major achievement for our village. Reminders and suggestions of things to do in June:

- Pinch out tips of fuchsias to encourage a bushy habit and more flowers.
- Dead head and cut back Oriental Poppies after flowering, cutting them close to the ground level, this will stimulate new foliage.
- Harvest early potatoes these are ready about ten weeks after planting.
- Keep an eye on garlic and onions when the leaves start to yellow and die back, they are ready to harvest.



Seventy five years ago on the 8th May,1945, Victory in Europe was all the news with great celebrations in every community. Sadly, I'm not sure what the celebrations were here. This part of our world was home to so many aircraft, and airfields (then called aerodromes) it must have also been tinged with sadness as so many of those planes never returned but were shot down in a foreign land. Perhaps some of you can remember the sight of postmen taking telegrams to homes with the news of a family member being killed whilst fighting. How hard and frightening life must have felt.

Villages in the First World War where all the men and women returned safely were called 'Thankful Villages', Ovington here in Norfolk was one of those. These villages who again saw everyone safely returned at the end of World War II were called 'Doubly Thankful Villages'. Sadly, Elmham was not one of those.

We know from the brass plaque in church and also our village archives that, nine of our fighting men never returned from fighting. The first to die was a submariner who was lost with all hands on his submarine, the second one had an accident going back from leave to his unit and was killed. He is in our churchyard as is another who was killed doing demolition work in London.

Four of our men were killed in the aftermath of the D-Day Landings when the fighting was very intense. A number of Elmham men were in the Norfolk Regiment and were prisoners of the Japanese, one of these men was being transported to Japan in a clapped out boat which, was torpedoed by the Americans and he was lost at sea. Finally, in 1945 the last of our Elmham lads was killed just a month before VE Day.

1890s to 1955 Rook & Ravencroft Time Line

Clarissa Vincent of Dereham, one of nine children, whose father owned a greengrocers store on Swaffham Hill married John Rook of North Elmham in April 1887, where they both ran a grocer and drapers shop in Eastgate Street, which eventually became the Post Office.

Prior to marriage and living in North Elmham, they were both servants in Sutton St Mary, Lincolnshire, in 1881 Clarrisa was a house servant and John, an assistant. The first time they were listed as living in North Elmham was recorded in the 1891 Census. Clarissa and John had five children, Emmeline, George, Kathleen (Kit), Ernest Cecil and Mary Madeline.

Emmeline (Emmie) born in Lincolnshire 1888 and died 1967 in Warwickshire.

George Frederick Rook born at North Elmham January 1890 and died 1931.

Kathleen (Kit) born at North Elmham 1892 and died in 1974 at Billingford.

Ernest Cecil Rook born at North Elmham 1895. Died prisoner of war in 1918 and is

commemorated on the village memorial. He is buried at Braine le Comte Belgium where he died of wounds whilst in German captivity during the Great War. He served as a Private with 2nd/7th Bn Sherwood Foresters (Notts and Derby Regiment).

Mary Rook, born at North Elmham in 1899, married William Ravencroft and ran the Post Office in Eastgate Street with her husband and died after childbirth in 1936

William Ravencroft was born December 17th 1897 in Whalley, near Blackburn. He worked as a trainee accountant before joining up to serve in the First World War. Following his return from active service as an acting Adjutant with the Royal Garrison Artillery in Ypres, Belgium, he married Mary Rook.

Following John Rook's death in 1921, the grocery and draper business carried on under the care of Clarissa and Mary.

When brothers Richard and William Ravencroft returned from the Great War, they bought Broadlands Farm on Station Road from the Sondes family estate, which was sold off around 1924 shortly after Elmham House was demolished. Broadlands Farm stands to the rear of the current chip shop and here they started a poultry business hatching and growing on White Leghorns . They also installed the first electric lights inside the large sheds to increase egg laying, the close proximity of the railway was key to the distribution of chickens and eggs.

Their partnership eventually came to an end around the late 1930s, at which time they sold up with the exception of a small plot of land on Station Road which they named Oakleigh. This is where William Ravencroft built a small bungalow, for his mother and father to live

Richard Ravencroft moved to Gressenhall to carry on with poultry farming, whilst

William took on the running of Elmham Post Office as sub post master. He was sub post master at North Elmham from 1931 to 1955

This became one of the largest postal areas in the Dereham district, eventually employed four postmen to deliver mail and telegrams as far as Litcham and surrounding villages, all by foot and bicycle.

Mary and William had three children, Joan, the first to be born in 1925, later joined the Girl Guides at the age of eleven eventually staying on to become Captain until she left the village with her father and step mother for Southport in 1955.

Ronald Ravencroft was the next to be born in 1930. He became a carpenter working for Messrs Mickelover Transport Ltd whose yard and workshop were situated across the road from the Post Office, where only the mangers house now remains. He was called up for National Service where he served with the Royal Army Ordnance Corps, attached to the 8th army, serving his time in Austria as part of the Occupation Force following WWII. On returning to Norfolk, he joined Norfolk Constabulary where he served as a Police Constable for 30 years service at Fakenham, Holt, Gayton and Dereham.

Peter Ravencroft was born in 1936, and unfortunately just after his birth his mother died of complications leaving William to bring up the family. Peter was sent to stay with an aunt in Birmingham before returning at the age of three to join the family in the Post Office, after William had married his second wife May (nee Maine).

Before coming to Norfolk, May worked as sectary to chairman of Ruston-Bucyrus established 1930 who built large crane excavators in Lincoln.

Post Office - Recollections

There were four post men, one of whom was Maurice Tombling's father. Peter Ravencroft remembers twenty-five sacks of parcels being stacked up in the post office at Christmas time.

County School was on Peter's rounds, he was post boy from 1951. Ron Ravencroft recalled cycling to Litcham in snow to deliver telegrams.

When Ron came home on leave from the army, his father William arranged for Ron Ravencroft to travel home in the early hours of the morning from Norwich station to North Elmham Post Office, sitting in the rear of the mail delivery van on all the sacks of post. The journey home was not a quick one as they had to unload mail at the various post offices on the way to Elmham.

During the Second World War, there was an air raid shelter dug into the garden near the old tree to the right hand side of the tin shed where Peter used to keep his prize chickens. Peter remembers his dad standing outside the shelter during an air raid alert and commenting on the various German planes flying over head. Ron remembered standing on the shed roof to watch aeroplanes taking off and landing at Swanton Morley airfield during the war.

William was asked to join the Worthing Home Guard during WWII but declined the offer; he'd had enough of army services having been wounded in Ypres Belgium during the Great War, and he would also have been busy with Post Office duties.

William, May and Joan all moved to Southport in 1955 in preparation for retirement, however William still needed to work and tried for a while to work in the local PO sorting office, although at his age it proved difficult to get on with a much younger work force. After a time, they became home sick, sold up and returned to live in the bungalow at Oakleigh Station Road in 1957.

Joan however remained in Southport finding work as a civilian clerk in the office of Southport Constabulary, where she stayed up until her death in 1986.

William Ravencroft died in 1965 at which time May moved into Lawes Court on Church Hill which was a sheltered home for the elderly, before passing away in a home for the elderly in Dereham.

Emily Ravencroft (Williams sister) became an expert Milliner, she also lived at Oakleigh in later years until old age and arthritis took their toll. Despite this she still managed to keep many geese and chickens within the garden, and she eventually moved to sheltered accommodation at Lamberts Court, Weasenham St Peter near Fakenham.

of Hobbies including one that was flying straight towards me. I didn't manage to focus the camera on this fast-moving falcon as it sped past me, but it was great to get a good look at its distinctive black and white underparts, orange 'trousers' and steely-blue back. Oystercatchers tend to be thought of as coastal birds but guite a few pairs breed inland in Norfolk before heading back to the seaside for the autumn and winter. You can sometimes see one or two flying over the meadows, presumably birds that breed locally, and their loud piping call alerts you that they are coming. They're very smart black and white birds with bright orange beaks.

Talking of black and white animals, the tiny Pied Shieldbug is an insect I've been hoping to find at the meadows. They like White Dead Nettles which grow plentifully here, so I thought they should be here, and this spring I finally found one. Another distinctive insect I found more by accident was the Red-headed Cardinal, a striking red beetle with black legs and elaborately branched black antennae.

There are lots more plants coming into flower now and the next month or so will be the peak period for seeing wildflowers, so keep your eyes out for all the different types when you visit. 




