HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DAYS

More household hazardous waste days to be held at Norfolk's recycling centres.

As part of the Norfolk County Council budget for the upcoming year, additional household hazardous waste events will be held across the county. These events will take place at seven recycling centres this spring, supplementing the usual autumn events.

The free events will be held throughout April and May 2025, and residents must use the recycling centre booking system to attend. Bookings will open one week before each event.

These events are exclusively for residents disposing of hazardous household waste. They are not open to businesses, groups, or other organisations. If residents do not have hazardous waste to dispose of, they will be directed to an alternative site, as the events are expected to be in high demand.

The spring hazardous waste events will be held on the following dates:

- 11th and 12th April at Dereham
- 9th and 10th May at Hempton

Please note, there will be no hazardous waste events over the Easter weekend.

NORTH ELMHAM PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

WEDNESDAY 5TH FEBRUARY

The following information is taken from the Draft minutes and may be expanded where the Editors feel more explana-tion is necessary. The full official minutes can be viewed in the Post Office and on the Community Website once approved.

Pre Meeting Business: None

Public Participation: It was felt that the village is very scruffy in a number of areas. Breckland Council will be asked to sweep the streets. Boars Hill has a new 20 mph limit and it was asked if Eastgate Street could have the same. Highways, Norfolk County Council will be made aware of this request. Two parishioners pick litter from time to time. The members are aware of this and appreciate their efforts.

Councillors Present: Mr. P. Grainger (Chairman), Mr. M. Phillips (Vice Chairman), Miss A. Ferris, Mr. T. Fitzalan Howard, Mr. B. Gee, Mrs. A. Keeble, Mr. N. Markwell, Mr. M. Rayner, Mr. C. Smith and Mr. J.Sowinski (co-opted at the start of the meeting)

Also in Attendance: Mr. K. Webb (Clerk) and two parishioners.

Apologies for absence: Mr. F. Gillespie and Mr. G. Bambridge (District Councillor)

Co-option of New Member

Joe Sowinski was proposed by Mr. Phillips and seconded by Mr. Fitzalan Howard. Agreed by all. He was welcomed to the Parish Council by the Chairman.

Updated Information And Matters Arising

Land Management Matters

Village Green: Mr. Gee has completely cleared the tree that fell down.

Broom Green: The Chairman is to speak to the Broom Green representative when appointed.

Millennium Wood (and Jubilee Wood): Mr. Sowinski has cut up damaged trees.

Allotments: Mr. Phillips reported that a large water container has been taken, presumably stolen.

Street Lights

Mr. Markwell has responded to the letter received from Debra Wicks of Amey, a national street lighting company with a local presence. They manage Norfolk County Council's Street lighting and signs. No update has yet been received from UKPN regarding the issue at 29 Eastgate Street.

Highway Matters

The matter regarding the temporary bus stop near the County School Station junction is now being dealt with by Rob Pratt, Public Transport Development Office, Highways, Transport and Waste, Norfolk County Council. It is the responsibility of the bus operator, Konectbus, to evaluate the site, apply their own health and safety criteria and accept the liability for serving it. Mr. Pratt says that it is clear that the stop is not suitable or safe and he will, therefore, be challenging Konectbus on its existence. Norfolk County Council has an obligation to transport children safely to their school and he is confident that the service 23 journey is subsidised by NCC. In parallel to the safety assessment, he will be talking to the school transport team as to how the problem can be overcome through their statutory obligations.

From Mr. Pratt's evaluation of the site, he concludes that locating the stops sufficiently away from the junction but also the curvatures in the B1110 that hamper visibility for overtaking cars, both to the north and south, is a significant chal-lenge. There is also the feasibility of constructing trods/footways on inadequate verges to allow safe passage

Pavilion and Playing Field

Miss Ferris reported that a new battery had been bought for the defibrillator at the Surgery.

It was agreed by all to pay the small invoice for £24.12 from Nurture as they had provided evidence that some cutting had been carried out in October of some small areas next to the Pavilion.

Brookside Development update

We have been advised that the road and footpaths are being asphalted and the work will be completed within a few days. Mr. Phillips will speak to the solicitors for an update on the current position.

Archive Group Records

The Chairman is to liaise with Mr. Smith.

Christmas Lights Arrangements

A letter had been received from the Chairman of the Elmham News Committee whose members were uncertain whether the switching on of the Christmas tree lights was an Elmham News or Parish Council event. As a result, they have made the decision not to be involved in the 2025 event.

The Parish Council members are adamant that it has never been regarded as a Parish Council event. As a gesture of goodwill, the cost of insurance incurred by the Elmham News had been refunded by the Parish Council. Any Christmas events for this year will be given appropriate consideration in due course.

Mention has also been made by the Chairman of the Elmham News of the five village notice boards which they had previously sponsored and installed. They wondered if the Parish Council would take over responsibility for maintaining them. It was the view that the boards were in generally good order and an asset for the village. It was felt that the general day to day responsibility for the input of items in the notice boards should remain with the Elmham News. The Chairman will inform the Chairman of the Elmham News.

New Village Hall

A sub committee has been formed and has initially assessed all activities currently taking place at the three buildings, i.e. the Pavilion, the Memorial Hall and the Eastgate Centre. Mr. Gee is to update the list now and on an ongoing basis. It will be circulated to members. The potential of each site and their values is to be considered. It will be particularly important to consult with Sport England. Mr. Sowinski is to join the committee which is due to next meet on February 25th.

Reports from District and County Councillors

Mr. Bill Borrett had submitted reports for December, 2024 and January, 2025. These can be viewed on the Parish Council section of the website.

Mr Gordon Bambridge Upper Wensum Ward Breckland Council Report to Parishes and Others Upper Wensum Ward Feb 2025

January has been extremely busy this year and February is developing in the same way. I have been working with our MP George Freeman and Terry Jermy the new Labour MP for the South of Breckland regarding domestic flooding issues in our area as a whole. Flooding seems to be getting worse and predictions are not good for the future, like many of you I live in a flood prone location, and recently came within an inch or so of water indoors so I do sympathise with those under threat. I have been the Breckland rep on the Norfolk Rivers Inland Drainage Board for over 22 years and have never had so many cases come up They do not make the news as they are mostly just one or two homes at a time, like mine, but they are a tremendous impact on the individual. It is to this end that I

have attached my report on the Norfolk Strategic Flood Alliance meeting last week to this note and as a couple have asked will also send you next week my Breckland report on the Association of Drainage Authorities annual meeting I attended this week (expect that in 2-3 days).

Flooding Hotline call 0344 800 8013 to report flooding anywhere in Norfolk. This is a single 24/7 reporting line.

At Breckland I am dealing with individuals enquiries as usual for a ward member including planning matters and missed bins which always top the list. I normally attend several Breckland meetings each month and have a policy of responding to emails promptly so please feel free to direct queries to my Breckland email.

Matters in process at the moment include the Breckland Budget which will be set next week (along with all your precept demands) That meeting will be live on youtube or can be watched later. The Breckland boundaries review, although with devolution we may not be here after 2027. Devolution itself which seems even closer that before, although we have been faced with this before, being political, which I do try not to be between elections, this is very much a labour part aim and policy to separate the people from the power in government. In Norfolk two tier government does work well, and in my opinion Districts are working better that County. If the proposals we have seen are introduced we will have another type or two tier in my opinion, and considerably more expensive. At the moment Breckland has the lowest council tax, so just balancing will mean we all will have bigger bills without the more costly mayoral//unity system. You will all make up your minds of course, and to help in this at least one session will be held for Parish Councils within the Breckland office.

Parishes struggling with the 'clunky' planning portal please talk to me or use the generic planning email at Breckland. I am told to expect a 'soon' resolution to it. As an individual I do not support the cancellation of the County Council elections in May. I believe it is a diminution of democracy and whilst some conservatives on County supported it others did not. It is definitely a labour party move to increase their influence in the shires and I have told senior members that is my opinion.

On 31st January I attended the Norfolk Flood and Drought Conference at County Hall representing the villages of Upper Wensum Ward and Breckland. I am sure some of you tuned into the live broadcast but for those who were not able to the gist of what happened is below and I am happy to seek to answer questions.

For me representing local people at these events enables a direct contact with senior people from different agencies on specific local matters which on this day including problems along the Wensum, protecting the Tud, various causes of flooding across the Ward.

Breckland issues including funding protection actions from many causes, the drainage levy and of course an extension of ward matters.

National issues such as how to react to huge increases in rates in some areas and how we can manage, and how other countries manage these.

3) Carriageway resurfacing works between 25th and 28th February (B1145 – B1110)

4) Parishioner concerns regarding the parking area behind and adjacent to numbers 2 to 6, Eastgate Street - (the Parish Council has no authority on this matter. It was felt that the parishioner should approach Victory Housing. The Chairman is to draw the matter to the attention of Tom Forster, Highways Department. Mr. Gee will also speak with the parishioner).

5) Letter from PCC advising the intention to close the old churchyard (The Clerk will liaise with Mr. Bambridge, District Councillor. It was noticed that the box B2 was not ticked regarding the presence of war graves).



At March's Wives Plus All Meeting in the Memorial Hall, North Elmham on Thursday 13th March Chris Bell Metrologist Weatherman and Presenter from Weather Quest and BBC Look East gave an illustrated and informative talk on how the daily weather reports are predicted.

Information from the Met Office web site states "that creating forecasts is a complex computer process which is constantly being updated." There are three important stages to a weather forecasts and Chris highlighted these to us:-

- Knowing what the weather is doing now,
- · Calculating how this will change in future
- Using meteorological expertise to refine the detail.

Therefore creating a modern day weather forecast starts with observing the weather,

not just locally but all around the world. In the past that data was plotted on charts and the weather forecast projected by humans on paper. In todays age weather observations including data from weather satellites orbiting the Earth are fed into supercomputers which calculate complex maths equations to predict the weather for the coming days and weeks. Over 200 billion weather observations are made daily and supercomputers from weather agencies from all over the World run their supercomputers to predict the weather in modern times. The role of the human forecaster is to interpret the data from the computers and discuss how it will impact the life and business of the end User such as farmers tending their animals and produce, and if the temperature is slightly lower than expected that can mean the difference between frost or not by the end

Online Triage

As you may all be aware by now, we recently introduced a new way of working which enables patients to request medical appointments and make administrative requests for sick notes for example using the online form.

We have been actively monitoring this change in procedure and as a result will be making some minor changes.

With effect from 12th March all medical online triage requests will be available on our website, www.elmhamsurgery.com from 7.30 until 12 noon.

After this time, you will not be able to access the triage form until 7.30 am the next working day.

If after 12 noon you believe your problem is urgent, please telephone the surgery.

For all non-urgent requests made after 12 pm, patients will be signposted for them to access care elsewhere where appropriate,

- Pharmacies are now able to see patients with coughs, colds, sore throats, earaches, infected insect bites, impetigo.
- The Walk in Centre in Norwich is open (7 am to 9 pm) for all acute minor illnesses and injuries.
- GP Front Door this service can be found at the NNUH and Queen Elizabeth Hospital Kings Lynn.
- Community Urgent Eyecare Service, who deal with all sore, red, or painful eyes, loss of vision or foreign body in eyes.

We aim to respond to all medical requests within 48 hrs

If you cannot access the internet, or do not have a smartphone, you can call the surgery between 10 am -12 noon. A Patient Service Advisor can then complete the online triage form for you on your behalf, alternatively paper copies of the form can be found in reception at the surgery.

Covid Vaccinations – Spring 2025

We will be carrying out covid vaccinations again this year, the clinics will be run from our Swanton Morley Surgery Site.

Those eligible for the vaccine will be the over 75-year-olds and those who are severely immunosuppressed, we will not be able to vaccinate under 18-year-olds.

We will be starting vaccination clinics at Swanton Morley Surgery in the w/c 14 April. We will be sending out the invites to all eligible patients via SMS again, as we have done in previous years, this will then allow you to book an ap-pointment using the link that is sent to you.

We will also be contacting the housebound patients from 1st of April onwards to arrange vaccinations for those patients who are completely housebound and have no means of being able to attend the surgery clinics.



species of moth in the UK whose larvae are likely to feed on clothes or carpets – out of well over 2,000 species. The vast majority of moths will do no damage at all to your textiles. The two that might are known as clothes moths but sometimes get called carpet moths. The moths that are properly called carpets are something entirely different, and they're completely safe around your carpets (although they'd prefer to be outside). These carpet moths are, at least I have always assumed they are, so named because they are among the relatively small proportion of moths that hold their wings flat to the ground when in normal resting position.

There are just two

This month I am going to talk about the Common Carpet, a very common species as its name suggests. As with many of the nocturnal moths the best way of finding them is to use a light-trap at night, but this species isn't too difficult to find during the day as well. They're a medium-sized moth with a wingspan of about 2.5 cm so they're not too hard to spot especially if they're resting on some darker vegetation and the pale colours of the moth stand out (photo 1).

At a glance you might be tempted to pass one off as a rather dull brownishwhite moth but take a closer look and you'll see they have quite attractive and intricate markings, at least when they







are fresh (they become a bit less exciting when they're worn). The exact pattern varies between individuals but they nearly always show a broad irregularly-edged dark band across the centre of the wings that is edged on both sides by narrower whitish bands. The dark band can become more uniform when worn (photo 2) but on fresh individuals it's made up of a complex mix of browns, beiges, blacks and greys.

I caught one in my garden once that had a much narrower dark band than usual (photo 3) – this is a very unusual form for this species and I don't think I've ever seen another one like it.

When they're relaxed they usually rest with their wings flat, but at other times they often hold their wings up (photo 4), sometimes held so tightly together that you can't see their upperwings at all.

Adult Common Carpets normally start flying in late April or May but they have two overlapping generations of adults each year, the first peaking in June and the second in July/August.

The caterpillars of Common Carpet feed on Cleavers and other bedstraws. Cleavers (photo 5) is sometimes known as Goosegrass or Catchweed among a whole host of other names. It's often regarded as an annoying weed, the Velcro-like hooks sticking to our clothes or pets' hair, but next time you feel like pulling some up to get rid of it, spare a thought for the Common Carpet caterpillars that might be relying on it for their next meal.

There are a few other moths that can be easily mistaken for Common Carpet. The most similar is a relatively scarce moth called Wood Carpet. It's so similar that some cannot be identified with certainty even in a lab but usually they're a little larger and have a broader, cleaner white band across the wings.

Another similar species that you're more likely to find is the Sharp-angled Carpet (photo 6). The name provides a clue as to how to tell them apart from Common Carpets – the dark band across the middle has a sharp-angled tooth pointing towards the rear of the wing.

The Silver-ground Carpet (photo 7) is quite variable and some can be fairly similar to Common Carpet, but they are normally much paler. This is another species that you can often find during the day – and especially at dusk on warm late spring evenings.

I've mentioned several relatively similar species of carpet but there are lots of different species that are much more distinctive and colourful (one of my favourites is the Barred Yellow, photo 8). 



WVBS

As I write we have just had a week of wonderful weather so it really feels as if spring may have arrived. I feel we have earned it, as the weather has not been kind to us recently. Our February out-door meeting was to have been a late afternoon at Stiffkey, where we could hope to see raptors coming in to roost, including Marsh, Hen and Pallid Harriers. But an icy onshore wind and rain caused it to be cancelled. We were luckier at the end of January when a clear cool morning greeted 15 members at Holkham Nature Reserve. It was Burns Night so this visit came with shortbread and poetry, courtesy of Ptolemy! Having parked in the village carpark, the group fist dipped in to Holkham Park, where they saw Nuthatches and Treecreepers, plus a couple of Roe Deer. Walking down Lady Anne's Drive they soon encountered the visiting wildfowl for which Holkham is famous in winter. Three Great White Egrets were dazzling in the bright light. In the pools on either side were Pintail, Shoveler and numerous Teal while on the grass were Lapwings and Curlews. Overhead Buzzards and Red Kites circled, and Marsh harriers frequently disturbed the grazing birds. There was even a rapidly flying Merlin.

Walking through the pines towards Washington Hide they passed Long-tailed and Coal Tits with flitting Goldcrests, and a reed-lined pool held Little Grebes as well as Gadwall and a Mute Swan. From the hide these was an excellent overview of the marshes full of geese, with the calls of Greylags and Pink-footed Geese keeping them company for the whole day. Further along, from the newly re-stored Jordan Hide they added White-fronted Geese to the list, rather rarer than the other geese, and also Egyptian Geese. Some members left at lunchtime, but afterwards the rest made their way to the beach for the afternoon. The main target bird at Holkham beach in winter is always the beautiful Shore Lark, which is very distinctive with its yellow and black head. They are not always easy to see but have been very obliging this winter, and sure enough eight were seen. In the same area, behind the dunes, there were also Skylarks. Linnets and Meadow Pipits. Out on the sea were large groups of Common Scoter, perhaps two to three thousand in all, and when they took flight a couple showed the white wing bars that identified them as the less numerous Velvet Scoter. There were also a couple of Great Crested Grebes, a Red-throated Diver, Herring and Great Black-backed Gulls and small parties of Red-breasted Mergansers.

The very busy spring months will soon be upon us, and there are lots of planned trips to make the most of them. Details of planned outings for the year can always be found on our website – WVBS.co.uk – along with reports of all indoor and outdoor meetings.



Put dates and water in pan and heat gently until soft. Remove from heat and mash to break up dates. Place all other ingredients in mixing bowl, add the dates and stir really well.

Spoon mixture into a greased and lined 2lb loaf tin and level the top. Bake for 75 to 90 minutes until a skewer comes out clean. NB: Cover with foil after 40mins to avoid a burnt top.

For extra decadence, butter it before serving!
