AFFORDABLE HOUSING SCHEME

Broadland Housing displayed and explained the two sites for an affordable housing scheme which have been put forward as potential locations by local residents (not by the Parish Council), with a third having been discounted due to concerns raised by County Highways. The two sites are Back Lane (with likely road access to Dereham Road) and Spencers Close (on the western part of the Village Green.)

Following this site selection community consultation event, held on Wednesday 6th July which was well attended by over 80 residents and members of the wider local community, the following views were lodged.

In summary:

- One person supported both sites perhaps in favour due to the general need for affordable housing
- Spencers Close received no other support
- Back Lane, 40 in support, 11 against

The main concern raised for Back Lane was Highway safety, which Broadland Housing will now investigate to see if this issue can be addressed. Further consultation with the community on design development should take place later in the year.

The Parish Council unanimously endorsed these views by supporting the selection of the Back Lane site.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING CONSULTATION THOUGHTS

Following the selection of Broadland Housing Association (BHA) by the Parish Council to deliver its proposals for a local needs housing scheme, all village households were sent a flyer inviting them to a consultation to select one of two sites identified as suitable for development. This consultation was held on the afternoon and evening of 6 July at the Pavilion, where parishioners were shown sketch plans of what the development could look like on each site. Examples of the types of housing suggested in the housing needs survey undertaken earlier in the year by BHA were on display and BHA and Breckland council representatives were on hand to respond to parishioners' questions and queries.

The event was reasonably well attended and those who turned up were asked to complete a short questionnaire before leaving. This collected general views on the scheme and identified parishioner preference for the Back Lanes site and almost total rejection of the highly contentious Spencer Close option. The data collected was presented by the BHA representatives at the PC meeting which followed. Six parishioners also attended the PC meeting seeking answers to more detailed questions about site access proposals, a pedestrian crossing and related issues.

The PC unanimously agreed that the Spencer Close option be rejected, and that the BHA should now progress with its detailed surveys and investigations into site access/egress site layout and associated matters. As these were likely to take several months to complete and were a prelude to a formal planning application, a further public consultation meeting would be scheduled when the results become available, expected to be in December.

EN will keep you advised of developments as they progress.

NORTH ELMHAM PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

WEDNESDAY 6TH JULY, 2022

The following information is taken from the DRAFT PC minutes and may be expanded where the Editors feel more explanation is necessary. The full official minutes can be viewed in the Post Office and on the Community website, once approved.

Councillors Present Were: Mrs. J. Borgnis (Chairman), Mr. M. Phillips, Miss A. Ferris, Mr. T. Fitzalan Howard, Mr. B. Gee, Mr. P. Grainger, Mrs. A. Keeble, Mr. N. Markwell, Mr. M. Rayner and Mr. C. Smith

Also in Attendance: Mr. K. Webb (Clerk), Mr. G. Bambridge, Mr. E.Mumford-Smith and Mr. A. Ballard (Broadland Housing), Mr. J. Heaton (Breckland Council) and seven parishioners.

Apologies for absence: Mr J Labouchere

Public Participation

A number of questions were asked and comments made about the possibility of a new Affordable Housing Scheme. It was mentioned that the current access road in Spencers Close is narrow with the cars of residents frequently being blocked in. It was also felt that there are potential problems for emergency vehicles. A letter had been received opposing the Back Lane site as an option.


It was explained that recent developments in the village had provided market houses. It is the intention for the Broadland Housing new scheme to provide social housing for local residents. A small number of market houses will be built to subsidise the scheme.

Update on Affordable Housing Scheme

Mr. Mumford-Smith, Head of Development, gave a brief background and history of Broadland Housing. There had been 200 responses to the consultation questionnaire regarding the project which it is proposed will result in approximately 15 houses being built which will include one third market housing i.e. 5 houses. In response to the Call for Sites, three had come forward but one was discounted by Norfolk County Council, Highways. The Housing Association had also contacted three other landowners but no other suitable land was forthcoming. It is important to stress that the Parish Council did not propose the Village Green land near Spencer's Close and had no direct part in the nomination of sites process.

The public information session, earlier in the afternoon, had seen a very good turnout with over 80 residents attending. One person supported both sites for the building of houses and ten people were not in favour of either. One letter had been received opposing the Back Lane location but 44 people supported the option of building there. It was acknowledged that there were road safety concerns, however, and it would be necessary for these to be carefully considered. At this point, it was apparent that the Spencer's Close site was not a realistic option and this position was supported by the Parish Council. Proposals are to be drawn up by Broadland Housing with the help of NCC, Highways with the aim being to produce another consultation letter later in the year (probably before Christmas). In addition, the important matter of nutrient neutrality issues is to be looked at in detail. Mr. Mumford-Smith said that the project would take in the region of four to five vears. The Parish Council endorsed the result of the consultation event and agreed to support the option of the Back Lane site whilst dismissing Spencer's Close. This was proposed by Mr. Rayner and seconded by Miss Ferris. All members were in favour.

At 8.10 p.m., the Chairman temporarily closed the meeting to enable two



parishioners to ask further questions. Information resulting from these was that the project would include four bungalows and that 5 to 6 market houses would be needed to ensure financial viability of the scheme. The meeting recommenced at 8.15 p.m. Mr. Mumford-Smith is to send a piece summarising the situation to Mr. Rayner which will be forwarded for insertion in Elmham News. It will also be placed on the website.

Police Information

Road safety data had been forwarded to P.C. Benton.

Land Management Matters

Village Green: Nothing to report. The land adjoining Spencers Close had been dismissed as a site for affordable housing (see above).

Cathedral Ruins: Mrs. Keeble said that English Heritage is visiting on 11th July.

Cathedral Meadows: Brown and Co have advised that it is in order to release details of the land agreements to parishioners. Hedges on either side of the lane are to be cut back. At the end of the year, Brown and Co. will recommend options under the new HLS system.

Broom Green: The grass has been cut.

Millennium Wood (and Jubilee Wood):

The grass in Millennium Wood has been cut. There has been no further progress with the two new seats.

Bridleway on disused railway line and other railway linked matters: Mr.

Rayner reported on the status of the two paths from County Station which were becoming overgrown. The higher one is not too bad but the lower one is a bit more difficult. No action is needed at present but monitoring will continue.

Allotments: Mr. Phillips reported that there is a small waiting list.

Street Lights: There is a light near Brookside which is constantly on.

Highway Matters

Resurfacing is to be carried out by the end of the month. The drain near the Post Office is blocked with weeds.

Pavilion and Playing Field

New goalposts are coming and the barrier has been replaced. A meeting is to be arranged with the CGM Group on Friday, 22nd July at 10.30 a.m. to discuss the grounds maintenance contract. The wall at the top of the field needs to be repaired and work will be done, following the RoSPA report, on the Skateboard area.

Youth Club Facilities

It is believed that an Active Norfolk Youth Co-ordinator for the area has been appointed. Mr. Bambridge is to investigate.

Improvements to the Frontage of North Elmham School

The work has been done.

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee in 2022

The Chairman, supported by all members, said that big thanks were due to Mr. Smith for all his hard work on the Platinum Jubilee.

Report from District Councillor

Mr. Bambridge has been asked to take over the Breckland Housing portfolio, which includes refugees and those from Ukraine. It is the desire of Central Government to disperse refugees all over the country. An old school in Elm Road, Thetford has been converted to provide 21 temporary homes for homeless people. Breckland is providing a new Local Plan and has had a Call for Sites. The bursary education scheme was well subscribed and is now closed. A peer review has been held which involves people from other Councils being sent in by the Local Government Association. A good verbal response has been made but it will be

As mentioned on the internet, it is a 20th century large house surrounded by a handsome garden which is open as part of the charitable National Gardens Scheme. The estate is owned by a branch of the Churchill family.

After partaking in delicious cakes with a cup of tea served by Kate we were shown around the garden of approximately 10 acres by Head Gardener Steve. The garden included a woodland area, mature yew hedging, shrub borders, fruit cage, cutting garden and bog garden, and an open air swimming pool, along with a sunken garden that was designed by Gertrude Jekyll VMH 1843-1932 who was a British horticulturist garden designer who created over 400 gardens in the United Kingdom, Europe and the United States and wrote over 1,000

LIFE AND THOUGHTS OF A COUNTRYMAN

Sometime ago I wrote about a gentleman who became a gamekeeper here in Elmham on what became the home of the Don family, living in the gamekeeper's cottage. During his working life he moved around other large estates in the County. Many years later we were next door neighbours of his mother, by then an old lady who was still living in the same house where Jack was brought up.

Jack Last wrote the booklet and had it published. I am not sure when. He is long gone now but I am hoping he would not mind if I dip into it from time to time.

School Days

"I was born in North Elmham on 22nd March 1915. My father was a gamekeeper on a hired shoot of roughly 2,000 acres, this being mainly a partridge shoot. He had another man for the nesting season to help.

My sister or I would go to Senter's Farm in the mornings before 8am to get the milk before going to school. My sister never went to school before she was seven owing to illness.

I was out of bed by 7am, and a wash with no tap water. We got water from the rain water butt outside, often breaking the ice in the Winter. No flush toilets, we had what was called a vault under the seat. The floor sloped away to a deep hole outside the lavatory. The hole was covered by a large slab. No toilet rolls, just squares of newspaper.

Breakfast was one or two slices of bacon and an egg and tea. That was it. Dinner was packed up for a bag on your back. Sandwiches could be bread and jam or cheese, with buns or tarts. No drink. If we wanted any, we went to the school pump."

Later, writing about the doings and businesses in the village... "In those days there was a Sunday School held in the school before church services on Sundays, the church fete held in the Vicarage grounds and prizes given in value for the attendance one had done at Sunday School.

The two chapels had Sunday School for children too, and a day at the seaside.

There was the George and Dragon and Kings Head pubs and the Railway Tavern and King William at Broom Green. There were eight shops, two bakers, one blacksmith, one harness maker, two cycle shops, two barbers or men who cut hair, two railway stations. The wireless first came to the village by the Headmaster's son who had been to America. He taught me a lot



for four years, two before I left school and two after, in my spare time, evenings.

There was a lad's Reading Room and the men's Institute, cricket, football. Bowls were played and Billiard teams, three in number. Milk was collected by horse and trollies and taken to the Creamery. There was a Bacon Factory near Elmham Station. We had a postman at 9.30 each morning, baker and butcher Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, fishman on Wednesday, shellfish man on Friday and also the hardware and oil man."

Ed's note: The Creamery was on the bend at the bottom of Eastgate Street, the baker and butcher delivered on the days mentioned as well as doing business in their shops. The hardware and oil men were vital for country folk as there was no electricity in the village in Jack's early years. The fishman and shellfish man would have probably rung a bell as they went through the village for the women to go out and buy from the basket or trolley.

As well as the businesses he mentions, Elmham was unique in having two stations at either end of the village. The station at the Elmham end created a lot of extra business. Obviously being in a rural area the railway was a lifeline for farmers as well as local people. Corn was sent away by rail, so were sugar beet, coal was here by rail to be collected by the local coal merchants, fertilizer was delivered for the farmers (have heard it was often rotting fish!) to be put on the land.

The Bacon was near the station deliberately so that it could be sent on its way quickly.

More from Jack in the future. He and his family lived in Keepers House off the Heath Road backing on to the wood.

SPECIAL PARTNERSHIP

A special service has commemorated the partnership formed between the Royal Air Force and United States Air Force during the Second World War.

The event, held at Robertson Barracks in Swanton Morley on Monday, July 4th, marked 80 years since the allied nations began joint air operations.

On July 4th, 1942, Winston Churchill and Dwight D. Eisenhower visited what was then RAF Swanton Morley, as British and American airmen took off for their first combined bombing raid. RAF(No 226 Sqn) and USAAF (15th Bomb Sqn) were flying Douglas Boston aircraft. The raid was carried out at low level against German airfields.

In the build up, 226 Squadron RAF had been tutoring the US 15th Bombardment Squadron.

Arranged by the Spirit of Coltishall Association (SoCA), The event included two short services at the air traffic control tower to remember the long and famous history of the airfield.

WVBS

There has been plenty of activity at Wensum Valley Birdwatching Society since my last report, much of which has been attended by new members who are making the most of the opportunity to learn from more experienced birders. In late April a trip to Lakenheath Fen RSPB yielded views of some of the earliest spring migrants like the Whitethroat and Sedge Warbler, and was accompanied by frequent calls of Cuckoos and occasional booms of Bitterns. Later in the day the group moved to Weeting Heath (NWT) for good views of the Stone Curlews which were obligingly nesting close to the hide. Luckily, they had also arrived on a day when a Hoopoe was displaying on the reserve, and were able to get a good look at this unusual visitor.

May provided two outdoor meetings, starting with a dawn chorus at Pensthorpe at 5.00 am on the 8th. 16 members braved the early start, and were guided by Amy, from Pensthorpe, who kindly hosted the dawn chorus meeting. They were rewarded with plenty of singing warblers on which to practise their song identification skills, and also visiting waders and waterbirds. The biggest attraction of this outing is probably the cooked breakfast available at the centre after the walk around! Very well-earned after seeing 69 species of birds. Later in the month member Emily led a walk around the broads and the River Ant from How Hill. This was a summer repeat of a successful winter visit and was again very much enjoyed by 14 members. They were amply rewarded by a sighting of a Bittern, which flew 300 meters in full sight with the sun shining on its back. And also, with the ice creams on the quay afterwards. (I don't want you to get the idea that members attend these trips for the food treats rather than the birds!)

June included a summer count of species in the valley, and an outdoor meeting at Sparham Pools, but more of these in my next report. There are full reports of all meetings on the club website - WVBS. co.uk. Indoors we have been treated to excellent accounts of the re-introduction of the White-tailed Wagle by Zoe Smith and the Beach- nesting Birds of East Anglia (especially Little Terns) by Paul Davis. Both of these speakers are closely involved in their respective projects, so these were truly 'from the horse's mouth'! Martin Hosier's photos of and talk on the wildlife of Borneo in June completed a splendid series. Again, reports can be read in full on the website.

NORTH ELMHAM WILDLIFE

Last month I wrote about a Lunar Hornet Moth I had attracted to a pheromone lure. These lures are usually developed to target one particular species but sometimes the scent is attractive to other species of moth as well. This is the case with the Lunar Hornet Moth lure which occasionally attracts a much smaller moth, the Small Timber Clothes Moth (photo 1). Although this moth had never been seen in Norfolk before. I left the lure out overnight in the hope of catching one and I caught two! Although they have "Clothes Moth" in their name, they (or rather their larvae) eat dead wood not your clothes! There are only two types of moth whose larvae might eat clothes, out of thousands, but several closely-related species also carry the name Clothes Moth. This one was thought to be extremely rare in the UK but we now realise that they're not as rare as we thought - just almost impossible to find other than by using the pheromone lure.

Another more attractive moth that got me excited this month was a Beautiful Yellow Underwing (photo 2). This is a rather small but attractively patterned moth. When it moves its forewings apart they reveal a bright yellow patch on the hindwings. They're usually seen on heaths, often during the day time, but they're not very common even in the right habitat so I hadn't been expecting to trap one at home.

I've mentioned Elephant Hawk-moths in this column two or three times over the years but not their smaller scarcer relative, the Small Elephant Hawk-moth. Most years I don't catch any but this year is a good year for them and I've caught several this month. Arguably less attractive than their bigger cousin but still pretty striking (photo 3). The Peach Blossom is a declining moth that I

hadn't seen for a few years but I caught a nice fresh one recently (photo 4). Their dark green wings are covered in big pinkish-white spots that are supposed to resemble cherry petals. Other striking moths that I haven't caught for a few years until this week are the large pale green Scarce Silver-lines (photo 5) and the equally distinctive Clouded Magpie (photo 6). The diversity in moths never fails to amaze me.

Lacewings are a much smaller group of insects than moths but they often come to light alongside the moths. There are far fewer species but as the county recorder for lacewings I have a special interest in them. This week I was particularly pleased to catch a species of brown lacewing called Wesmaelius concinnus (no-one's ever given most of the lacewings English names) (photo 7). The last time this species was identified in Norfolk was in 1994 so they don't seem to be very common.

As I write we're in the middle of a heat wave. Hot nights result in a busy moth trap in my garden - this week I caught over 1,000 individual moths in a single night and I caught around 160 different species of moth the night before - not to mention all the other nocturnal insects that are attracted to light. Sorting through all of these, identifying them, counting them, recording them and, in due course, submitting all the records to the county database, takes a toll! I love it, but as enjoyable as it is, it doesn't leave me with much time to do other things. Consequently I haven't been out and about around the parish as much as I would have liked recently. The times I have been out have been rewarding though.

On one walk along the railway I was pleased to see a Norfolk Hawker dragonfly (photo 8). Until recently if you wanted to see a Norfolk Hawker in the UK you would have needed to visit the Norfolk

Think ... It won't cost the EARTH!

Broads, but during the last decade they have colonised southern England. These new arrivals probably didn't originate from the Broads but from the Continental population which, like several other dragonfly species, is shifting northwards as a result of climate change. Now they can be found over much of Norfolk, not just in the Broads, so I was half-expecting that I might find one round here sooner or later. They're big dragonflies with brown body (but not brown wings, unlike Brown Hawker), green eyes and a little yellow isosceles triangle at the base of the body between the wings, which gives it its scientific name Aeshna isosceles.

Another smart dragonfly seen a couple of times this month is the Broad-bodied Chaser. It should be quite common round here but I haven't seen them very often. Males are blue-bodied but females (photo 9) are browner; both sexes have a large dark patch at the base of the wings which separates them from most of the other similar species.

Robberflies are a family of flies that exhibit some fascinating behaviours. Most eat other flies but the red-legged robberfies are more partial to parasitic wasps. I found a male and female Common Redlegged Robberfly coupled together and noticed that male didn't have the female's undivided attention - she was busy munching a parasitic wasp (on the right in photo 10). Another type of fly that has unusual behaviour is the Stripe-faced Dronefly, a type of hoverfly. The male hovers in the air just above the female as she rests or feeds on a flower (photo 11) as far as I know this behaviour is unique to this one species.

Fish are a group of animals that I don't have a lot of experience of. Not being an angler I don't see live wild fish very often, but sometimes when you're walking along the dyke that runs along the railway between the Cathedral Meadows and

County School Station, you can look down into the dyke and see them there. I think the one I photographed recently (photo 12) is a Chub, but I'm no expert in fish identification so any anglers among you please correct me if necessary.

NORTH ELMHAM PARISH COUNCIL MEMORIES

I was Clerk to North Elmham Parish Council from 1983 until 1997. I have a great many memories of the work undertaken during these years. In the run up to Parish Council Elections in May 2023, I thought it might be a time to reflect on the various activities and achievements of the Parish Council. Hopefully readers will find this interesting and it may even encourage new members to join the council next year. It is the efforts of the Parish Council which make a community. My first article, in last month's Elmham News, detailed about the appointment of the Clerk. So, here is a second article which briefly explains the role of the Chairman.

The Chairman is elected every year at the first meeting of the Council – the Annual Parish Council Meeting. That meeting must be held in May unless it is an election year (2023) in which case it must be held within 14 days following the election. My first Chairman in 1983 was ClIr Eddie Bidewell. Eddie and his wife Betty lived at Silverstone Farm on the Heath. Eddie was keen to get through the meeting, and the use of the gavel helped! A gavel is a wooden hammer or mallet which is brought down hard onto the table to bring everyone to attention. It will disarm conversation and more than likely make the Clerk "jump". I have always sat to the right-hand side of the Chairman - so jump I did!. The meeting should really be controlled through the Standing Orders of the Council not the gavel. Standing Orders say such things as how long councillors are allowed to speak. I am not sure I ever found the Standing Orders when I first started the job. Somewhere in the bottom of one of the many boxes I inherited when I took the job on! All seemed to be quite uneventful in that first year with potholes and street lights continuing to dominate the meeting until there was a significant event. There was an accident on the "Green Field". At that time the play equipment – old and well used (in fact I had used it as a toddler) was to the right-hand side of the Green Field. The equipment comprised swings, a see-saw, a roundabout, and a huge slide which you had to climb - it seemed to reach the sky. No safety surfacing. These were the early days of health and safety. We had to have the equipment inspected and sadly the verdict was that everything should be removed. Gone was my childhood it seemed. Other than this the council year sailed by, although I do recall one councillor coming in late to a meeting one evening. He made a serious attempt to talk sensibly but it was quite obvious to me what the problem was. The meeting had nearly finished when the Chairman nudged me and said what is wrong with him? I had noticed the councillor was holding the agenda upside down and was pretending to read from it. "He is the worse for wear" I whispered to the Chairman! At least that Councillor had come along to the meeting...and contributed to the debate!

This means that there was no evidence of external influences such as foul play, suicide, alcohol, drugs, accident etc. and that the death was natural but that the Coroner was not able to establish the precise natural cause.

The family would like to thank everyone who sent their condolences and those of you who were able to attend John's funeral.
