#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Swanton Morley was a very active airfield during World War II and continued as a RAF station until August 1995. Then it was taken over by the Army.

Did you know that Winston Churchill and Dwight Eisenhower both stood side by side at Swanton Morley on July 4th 1942. They came to watch as twelve Douglas Boston aircraft took off on a joint raid.

This was the first time the American Air Force took to the skies here in Great Britain. The British and American crews took off to bomb four airfields in the Netherlands in a daring low level daylight raid. On this occasion, 4th July, 1942, the airmen took off from Swanton Morley in four sections of three aircraft, each led by an experienced 226 Squadron crew.

This was officially the first USAAF unit to bomb targets in Europe. Very sadly two bombers, crewed by the Americans and one British bomber were lost in the raid.

This year to commemorate the occasion in 1942, the organiser, Major Purbric, said 'Tonight was a joint commemoration of those who have flown an op from this airfield during the Second World War.'

Station and Unit Commanders from RAF Mildenhall, RAF Lakenheath and RAF Marham were at the celebration along with Generals, Admirals and other serving and past members of the British and American armed forces and supporters.

We know the Americans were stationed here in East Anglia, some of them being very local to us. We've heard the mantra 'over paid, over sexed ,over here' and we know many local girls were delighted to see these smart young airmen. Their uniforms were magnets for local girls.....

On the Back Lane, there is a memorial for two airmen from Swanton Morley who

lost their lives, just over the hedge from the memorial in 1944. One of the crew was a New Zealander and the other was British. They were training, but missed the runway as they came into land so were going around again when sadly they crashed and were killed.

## THE DIAMOND JUBILEE GREEN

After learning about the yet more vandalism of the storm shelter on the village green, I decided to check back on how it came to be put there.

A decision was made to move the play equipment from opposite the village shop (next to the now Pavilion) to the much safer area of the new playing field, which the Parish Council had managed to buy with grants and donations from trusts, businesses and village folk. It was yet to have an official name. This area lies within the triangle formed by Oak Avenue, Spencer's Close and Eastgate Street and seemed to be ideal. A committee was formed with three Parish Councillors, Jim Heffernan as Chair, Martin Phillips as Treasurer and Peter Braybrook, plus residents

Caroline Payne, Debbie Warner and Meg White. The aim was to raise as much money as possible and then to decided what could be bought for that amount. We were fortunate to have a volunteer, Ruth Luckett who was able to write the application forms for all the organisations and trusts and councils that we applied to for grants. This was an art in itself, as the correct wording yielded good results and we began to get some positive responses.

The rest of us bent our minds to raffles, bingos, fun days organised by Debbie Coull, Christmas fayres and the like. Huge amounts of marmalade were made and sold, a beautiful quilt was made and raffled, our local biker group and the two pubs arranged quizzes.

All in all, we managed a magnificent £56,939.32.

Then came the difficult task of spending it – wisely!!

It was decided to fence it, to protect the little ones and to keep dogs out! And a total of £51,234.11 was spent.

Finally on Sunday, May 11th 2015 we officially opened the area in style, with games, Beer and Pimm's tent, barbeque and refreshments.

The storm shelter was added later in 2016 as it was felt that it would be a nice place for mums with babies to sit whilst watching their older children play and to give shade to walkers. Nowhere was it said it should be used for mindless acts of

vandalism – like graffiti, setting fire to or just kicking it for the sake of it.

The area was dedicated as the The Jim Heffernan Play Area in memory of Jim, who sadly passed away in April 2016.

Fortunately, the Green remains an oasis and is enjoyed by everyone who uses it.

#### **KATE WYATT RIP**

Kate's funeral was well attended by her family and friends. Her flowers were topped by her distinctive hat, which was often seen. Other flowers were specifically taken from her garden and made a beautiful display.

Kate, who suffered from MS was a well-known figure in her wheelchair and was always accompanied (until recently) by Charlie, her golden King Charles spaniel. When she and her husband Mike came to the village, she was already wheelchair bound but that didn't stop her from getting out and about and she was an active campaigner for proper access for the disabled. She had in her early career been heavily involved in the Tufty Club, a nationwide scheme to teach Road Safety to children which started in 1953 by RoSPA.

The following tributes have been collated by her friend Jenny and were given by her at the Memorial Service for Kate.

Paul, a fellow MS sufferer put it this way, "Kate was a real friend, full of character and overcoming the shock of her husband's illness and the loss of her beloved pet Charlie, not forgetting her own health problem. Kate was someone I could rely on. I will miss her terribly".

Jean, Kate's immediate neighbour said, "Kate was never a victim, she always strove to do more, nothing would put her off".

Julia, another close neighbour recalled Kate visiting her "to have a cuddle with her dog Tilly after she lost Charlie. Kate always found a way to overcome, she was a very creative person".

Joyce, a long term friend and colleague from W.I. days echoed Julia saying, "Kate was a valued member, always participating in meetings and especially enjoying craft events". Beryl said," Kate always made me think I could and should do more – especially when I saw her out

and about in all weathers. I had so much respect for her".

Pam, Kate's carer for many years said" Kate was so much more than an employer, she was a kind and trusted friend, interested in my family and especially my grandchildren." Gill remembers her loving to chat either on the phone or just as she was passing by.

Folk afternoons at the King's Head with friends and neighbours were a particularly precious time for Kate, who because of her disability was unable to go out in the evenings to enjoy live music.

In essence, once you had met Kate, it wasn't possible to forget her. Dear Kate, go well, with thanks for all your love and friendship, from us all.

Visit our website www. derehamhireandsales.co.uk TRADE & DIY WELCOME The Wymondham to Wells line opened in stages between February 1847 and 1857, after Parliamentary consent was given in 1845. The line became part of the Great Eastern Railway in 1862.

There was a branch of the line which turned right at Broom Green, just after what was the bridge (now has no top) and carried on to Wroxham. This was closed in 1952, presumably it was uneconomic to run.

The coal fired trains (oh that evocative smell) were phased out in the mid 1950's and diesel units began hauling the carriages on 17th September 1955.

Very sadly the Dereham to Wells line ceased to run in October 1964 and passenger services closed in October 1969 from Dereham to Norwich. However, the line remained open for freight for a number of years after 1964.

I know you may have read this before, but when I was a student in London in the early 1960's, my father would take my trunk to the station at County School. It would be delivered in London the next day either to my college or digs. Bet you cannot do that today!

#### **DEAR EDITORS**

As we all know, transportation plays a crucial role in our daily lives. However, not everyone in our community has access to a personal vehicle (their own or lifts from family members or friends), and public transport is limited and not always appropriate. Private taxi fares are out of reach for many and hospital transport not always available. These can all result in inconvenience, limited mobility, and isolation.

A Community Car Scheme would address these challenges, and I understand that North Elmham did benefit from one in the past. My sister in law is a local carer and also looks after our elderly parents.

She is all too aware of the challenges. As working people, it is sometimes difficult to get our parents to essential doctor and hospital appointments, let alone social activities, which are so beneficial. We know such a scheme would be well used, but would need volunteer drivers, someone to coordinate journeys and have the support of our Parish Council. I gather from other local schemes that passengers pay a small fare, and the drivers are refunded the mileage they cover at the HMRC 45p per mile rate, with any shortfall being paid by the local parish council with help from a Breckland Council grant.

We believe that a Community Car Scheme would be a valuable addition to our community and will be asking the Parish Council to consider investigating its viability at their meeting on August 2nd. If you would like to support this initial approach, it would add weight to our request. You can email your support to the Parish Clerk if you can't make the meeting in person - Kevin Webb, northelmhampc@hotmail.co.uk. Meetings take place on the first Wednesday of the month at the Sports Pavilion. Public speaking takes place before the meeting starts at 7.30 pm.

#### **GARDENING CLUB**

Our June visit took us to Peter Beales Roses at Attleborough. The forecast said "possibility of rain"

We were welcomed by Simon in the middle of a thunderstorm, torrential rain and ushered into a big marquee for refreshment and to dry off.

He gave us great insight into the way they grow their roses and with 28 Gold Medals from Chelsea, 18 of them on the trot, including this year, we felt he knew what he was talking about. They have 1100 types of roses and 400 varieties of clematis and 2½ acres of gardens, looked after by one gardener!

He showed us how they take wild rose root stock and graft the required variety onto it, a delicate but precise process. They have 250,000 of the rootstock waiting to be transformed. A good piece worker can graft 5/6000 a day. None of us volunteered to try it!

Simon spoke of the need to water roses daily and to feed regularly and recommended different types of feed.

By now it was still raining, but we gathered our umbrellas and followed him out into the garden to walk round and admire the beautiful roses. Anecdotes flowed and we duly followed, asked questions and smelled the blooms from tiny ones to one that must have been six inches across and still holding her head up in the rain.

As he finished, it was just a mild rain and we had a short while to look around the plants and shop, armed with a discount voucher!

The sun shone all the way home, but we got caught up in a queue caused by two car accident on a narrow lane, with two ambulances and assorted police cars and a fire engine. ## NORTH ELMHAM WILDLIFE

Last month I wrote about flies that aren't flies – insects whose names suggest they might be flies, but which are in fact not closely related to the true flies. This month I'm going to write about flies that are flies – real, true flies.

Some of you will be squirming now. Flies don't rate highly in the popularity stakes of British wildlife. But they're diverse, fascinating and incredibly important to us, whether we like them or not.

Do you like chocolate? If so, then thank the tiny biting midges that are far and away the most important pollinators of cocoa plants and without which we would have no chocolate. Do you like fruit and vegetables? Flies are among the most important pollinators for many of our fruit and vegetables from blackberries to carrots.

Do you want all your favourite garden plants to be damaged by aphids? If not, then thank the hoverfly larvae for keeping the aphids under control. Do you want to walk knee-deep through dead animals and excrement? If not, then be grateful to the flies for the major role they play in decomposing and disposing of these unpleasantries.

Do you enjoy watching swifts and swallows? Do you enjoy hearing the beautiful melodies of our summer warblers? If so, then remember we would have none of them if there weren't any flies for them to feed on.


Probably our largest flies, at least in terms of wing-span or leg-span, are the craneflies. I knew them as Daddy Longlegs when I was a child, but many people use that name to refer to equally longlegged cellar spiders. There are lots of different species of craneflies including the yellow-and-black striped Tiger Cranefly (photo 1).

St Mark's Flies are so called because they emerge in the second half of April around St Mark's Day. They're robust black flies that can be found swarming in huge numbers when they first emerge. Other members of their family are generally smaller and many are red and black or red, yellow and black like the Downland Bibio (photo 2).

Fungus gnats are incredibly dainty little flies with very long antennae. One of the ones I see most often is called *Macrocera phalerata*, a red-bodied fly with dark markings in their wings (photo 3) – so pretty and delicate!

Gall midges are little flies that are most often detected not by the fly itself but by the galls that they cause. Eggs are laid on the host plant and the plant produces a gall in which it hosts the fly larva lives as it develops. One of the most easily recognised fly galls is that of a species called *Hartigiola annulipes* – the galls are hairy columns protruding up from the surface of beech leaves, often several on a single leaf (photo 4).

Moth flies, sometimes called drain flies, are a group of small squat flies with broad hairy wings. They're often mistaken for tiny moths and look quite unlike any other flies. They're hard to identify to species though – I think the one in photo 5 is called *Boreoclytocerus ocellaris*.

Snipeflies have piercing mouthparts and the adults use these to drink mammal blood, but humans aren't their usual target and I've never had any problems with them biting me. The common Downlooker Snipefly (photo 6) is sonamed for its habit of perching with its head facing downwards.

Perhaps the flies that generate the most fear among people who aren't flies' biggest fans are the horseflies, a family that includes deerflies and clegs. Certainly they can deliver quite a bite and a small minority of people can react quite badly to them. But nip aside they're rather

attractive beasts often with colourful eyes and striking patterns on either their bodies or wings. I was in the Lake District last weekend and saw some Giant Horseflies which were probably the largest-bodied flies I've ever seen, but you don't get those here. One of the more strikingly-patterned members of the family I've seen in North Elmham is the Splayed Deerfly (photo 7).

Bee-flies are great! They appear on sunny spring days and are easily recognised – at least the common Dark-edged Bee-fly is – by the big hairy bodies and long straight proboscis sticking out in front (photo 8). They may look like they could use it to pierce your skin but they're completely harmless to humans and just use it for drinking nectar.

Soldierflies are another lovely group. Some are quite smartly uniformed which I assume is what gives the family their name. Others have brilliant metallic green bodies. The common Twin-spot Centurion (photo 9) is named after the pair of white spots next to its eyes.

Although robberflies (like the Common Red-legged Robberfly, photo 10) are capable of giving humans a painful nip if mishandled, the only things that have any real cause to fear a robberfly are other invertebrates, especially flies. Robberflies are master hunters, lying in ambush and then usually catching their prey in flight when it comes too close.

Many flies are difficult insects to identify and consequently many naturalists focus on easier groups of wildlife to study. But one group of flies that are relatively easy to identify and for which there are good resources available to help are the hoverflies. Consequently they're relatively well-recorded. I could probably do a whole piece on hoverflies – in fact maybe I will one day... For now, suffice to say they're your friends if you're a gardener as they help keep aphid populations down and also help with pollination.

Conopid flies are parasites of bees and wasps. Females pounce on their hapless prey and swiftly insert an egg into the abdomen of the bee or wasp, which later hatches inside the victim and eats if from the inside. I don't see them very often, but when I do it's usually a mating pair of Ferruginous Bee-grabbers (photo 11). They seem to be exhibitionists, choosing exposed perches to go about their business on.

The Looped Flutter Fly is a crazy-looking insect – a tiny fly which holds its wings out to the side and waves them around. The wings have a unique dark-coloured loop pattern on them which makes them quite unmistakable (photo 12). They often come into houses so you might not need to go far to find one, but you'll need good eyes or a lens to see the pattern as they're quite small. It's thought that their larvae may feed on beetles.

There are several families of flies that mostly have complex patterns of dark markings on their wings and collectively these are known as picture-winged flies. There's a huge variety of patterns among the different species but I'll just share one for now, a species called *Tephritis vespertine* (photo 13).

There are so many more flies I would love to tell you about but there's a limit to how many I can fit in. And that's just the ones I know about – there are loads of different families of flies that I don't know much about at all. Every now and then something in an unfamiliar family catches my eye and I decide to try and identify it. One example was the dark-winged fly with big red eyes (photo 14) that I eventually worked out was something called *Protoclythia rufa*.

Keep on getting in touch with me if you spot any interesting wildlife in the village. This month I heard about a Black Redstart that has taken up residence in someone's garden. Related to robins, redstarts are recognised by their orangey-red tail which they tend to flick up and down. Black





Redstarts naturally live in rocky cliffs in European mountains but have colonised urban areas in many places finding enough similarity between big buildings and rocky cliffs. They colonised the UK during the last world war making use of ruins in bomb sites, but they remain a very scarce breeding bird in the UK. Recently there have been a small number of pairs in Norwich but I've never heard of one in North Elmham before. This will be an informal service led by Michael Newey, our Authorised Worship Assistant. Everyone is very welcome to join us.


Of course, if it is raining, we will meet in the church, but let's hope it is a lovely sunny day.

£27,000. This money pays for building insurance, electricity bills and our contribution to the costs of ministry.

#### **MORE TO LIFE**

As we head into summer, the media has been in a frenzy over the alleged inappropriate behaviour of high profile personalities. Following on from Phillip Schofield, there has been at least one high profile BBC Newsreader and a high profile church leader with a massive ministry. I am not going to focus on their alleged misdemeanours as investigations are ongoing, but suffice to say that many have voiced their support for the individuals concerned because they are 'successful', 'professional', 'nice guys'. Now, investigations may well prove the innocence of those concerned, but it highlights the kind of gaslighting that happens to the abused every day. Certainly, in the case of the latter, it appears that many had tried to raise concerns about the behaviour they had experienced but were shutdown.

Survivors of abuse will be able to identify with this well. There is a pervasive thought that if the abuser has a 'good job', 'is a pillar of the community', or in church terms 'has a 'successful' ministry', then any allegations of abuse must be quashed and stamped on because such people would never do such a thing.

Sadly, this happens all too often. Just because a person is 'nice' or 'successful' does not prohibit their potential to abuse.

Extreme caution should be taken as most dogs, particularly those who are large, obese, flat-faced and very young, will find these temperatures very uncomfortable.



Even at this temperature dogs are at risk of getting heat stroke if exercised too rigorously, or suffering from an underlying condition such as obesity or breathing difficulties.



Generally safe to exercise dogs at all times of day, although keep a close eye on large, obese and flat-faced breeds.



No evidence of heat stroke risk so enjoy your walk.


