

COUNTY SCHOOL SEVENTY YEARS AGO

If you are going to Fakenham, you will pass the site of a large school for boys on a hill overlooking the Wensum. These boys were destitute, many were orphans, with no family at all. There were over 300 lads from small babies to teenagers, some of them had mothers who couldn't cope, some whose families had fallen on hard times and children who had been put into various homes for waifs and strays.

Watts Naval School

Originally the building had been built as a school for gentlemen's farmers sons, but it was not viable and closed in the 1890's. In 1901 the school was generously donated to Barnados as a home for destitute boys; it would be able to accommodate 350 boys from about 10-16 years old. The benefactor was Mr Edmund Hannay Watts, Head of the British Steamship Company, and it was hoped that these youngsters would benefit from a strict regime of discipline and nautical training. He agreed to fund the purchase of the site and its alterations. And the school was subsequently named after him.

The building itself was very impressive. Its rooms and corridors were named after naval places and battles. It looked like a ship inside and was run like a ship with a harsh regime, though over the years, old boys who have come back to say it was fair and they remember their time there with great affection.

There were younger children too, but they lived in the cottages with a foster mother. I can remember when I was in the first class at Elmham Primary School, a young boy joined our class just for a while. I have never forgotten his name, it was Geoffrey Rainbird which sounded so appealing.

Many of the boys joined the Royal Navy or Merchant Navy when they were about 14

years old. Life was tough for them! Don't get the impression that the lads had to join up; many of them stayed around here and I think some returned home when they were old enough to be employed to help with the family's finances.

The School was self-contained with its own chapel, infirmary, playing field, swimming pool (with river water) its own band and classrooms for lessons. Life was hard for them, no frivolities.

As a young child I loved to see the boys marching into the village and I have always been in love with those blue uniforms. The photo shows two of the boys in their uniforms.

I wanted to join the Navy when I left school but my mother vetoed that idea. It was those uniforms which impressed me!

BRECKLAND UPDATE

Here is a brief update to explain what happens next with Breckland District Council's Local Plan following its latest round of public consultation, with the Parish Council's comments being available to read in full on the North Elmham Community website at www.elmham.org.uk.

In brief, these supported the allocation of site NEL2 for 50 houses off the top of Back Lane bounded by Holt Road and Eastgate Street, and the substitution of the only submitted brownfield site at Station Yard to replace site NEL1 for 30 houses off Eastgate Street to the east of Orchard Close, which is currently preferred by Breckland.

The overall number of about 80 new houses to be built during the 5-year life of the plan is something which has been decided by central government, in terms of the total number of dwellings to be built across Breckland. Breckland has then decided, subject to the Plan being approved, that North Elmham should have about 80 new houses. The Parish Council felt these two sites were the best of those



available from the 'call for sites' to provide the total required number of new houses.

There will be one more round of consultation known as the Regulation 19 consultation, unless Breckland DC decides to have an additional round. At that point, probably later this year, comments can only be made as to the legal compliance and 'soundness' of the proposed Plan, before it goes to an Inspector for examination.

FAKENHAM CHORAL SOCIETY

Spring Concert

At its Spring 2026 concert Fakenham Choral Society will be performing Louis Vierne's Messe Solennelle and Matthew Coleridge's Requiem.

Vierne's Messe solennelle, composed in 1899, was scored for choir and two organs. It was published in 1900, before it was first performed at Saint-Sulpice in Paris in December 1901. It was later adapted for a single organ, as most churches could not provide two such instruments.

Matthew Coleridge is a UK-based choral composer whose music is regularly performed by amateur and professional choirs around the world. His Requiem has become one of the UK's most popular new choral works and is a regular fixture in the upper reaches of Classic FM's annual Hall of Fame.

Rosemary Dear, Chair of Fakenham Choral Society, says: 'We really like the idea of complementing a new work with something older and more traditional and chose these particular pieces of music as both require an organ accompaniment

rather than our usual use of an orchestra. We are hiring an organ for the concert and the organist will be a previous FCS accompanist, James Mooney Dutton.

'The Coleridge has become very popular on Classic FM so, although it is a relatively new work, many people will have heard some snatches of it already. The Vierne is a big and bold work that will fill the church with the sound of both voices and organ.'

The concert will take place at Fakenham Parish Church on Saturday 21 March at 7.00pm. Tickets are £18 tickets with an early bird price of £15 before 7th March, see www.fakenhamchoralsociety.org

During the interval there will be wine and soft drinks to purchase.

IAN STANLEY NICKERSON

Ian, born 21st October 1957 attended Tunstead Primary School, followed by Broadland Secondary School. He left school dreaming of becoming a painter and decorator. The early mornings of his milk round brought a quiet sense of independence, while the Saturday job at a garden in Wayford Bridge, near Stalham, filled his weekends with the scent of soil and growth. During this period, he and his sister Cathy eagerly anticipated weekends at stockcar races, sharing the laughter and excitement. Later that winter, when invited to help in the owner's flower shop in Stalham, Ian discovered a genuine joy for working with blooms, a passion the took root in his heart. After completing his earlier education, he eagerly pursued his passion for floristry at Isle College in Wisbech. There, he proudly obtained his City and Guilds and a National Diploma from the Society of Floristry. These hard earned qualifications later enabled him to share his enthusiasm by teaching the subject.

After completing his studies, he worked in Pamela's, Bonds Floral department in Norwich, then moved on to Daniel Brothers (now Notcutts). By the age of 22 he became the manager at Allborough & Son Florist in Wymondham.

Soon after taking on a management role, he opened a shop in North Walsham for a short time. In 1984 he launched his own first shop, 'The Flower Box' with a business partner, in Attleborough. During this time, he also taught at Easton College, the nationally accepted City and Guilds standard of proficiency for florists, at Bull Road in Norwich. This is where he met Brenda Ravencroft and became good friends with her and her husband Ronald, who ran their business here in North Elmham.

After 10 years in the Attleborough business, he was asked to take over a Dereham shop from Margaret Brooks who



was retiring in 1994, and renamed it 'Ian's Floral Studio'. After 29 years, he retired on 28th February 2023 as a professional florist.

He kept his hand in presenting demonstrations here in the village and the surrounding areas. Sadly he did not get to enjoy a long retirement as ill health took its toll. He was taken to the Norfolk and Norwich on New Year's Eve and passed away surrounded by family and friends on 3rd January 2026.

He loved his village of North Elmham and its people who welcomed him.



NORTH ELMHAM PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

WEDNESDAY 5TH NOVEMBER

Councillors Present Were: Mr. M. Phillips (Acting Chairman), Miss A. Ferris, Mr. T. Fitzalan Howard, Mrs. A. Keeble, Mr. N. Markwell, Mr. M. Rayner and Mr. J. Sowinski.

Also in Attendance: Mr. K. Webb (Clerk) and two parishioners

Apologies for absence: Mr. B. Gee, Mr. F. Gillespie, Mr. P. Grainger, Mr. C. Smith and Mr. G. Bambridge (District Councillor)

Public Participation

Dr. Peter Wade-Martins raised the following topics:

The Ruins: A paper by Dr. Wade-Martins in an academic journal, Norfolk Archaeology, has just been published which overturns the 1982 interpretation that the ruined church was a bishop's chapel and reinstates the long-held view that it is, in fact, the Anglo-Saxon cathedral. He said that we can feel proud that we do have such an important historic building.

Community Hall: He felt that Parish Council minutes give the impression that this project is making little progress. He said that some people are asking what has happened and how soon will this project be opened up to a wider discussion in the village? He was also of the opinion that the Institute is showing signs of becoming an unstable structure.

Traffic Calming at the School and Post Office Corner: Dr Wade-Martins said that, in addition to the pinch-point at the doctor's surgery, the intention agreed with the highways engineers was to have a build-out at either end of the 20 mph zone. The build-out has been installed at the southern end of the zone, but the equivalent at the north end was put on hold until the new school car park had been finished so that traffic movements could be reviewed. Current speeds for

south-bound traffic coming down church hill suggests that there is every reason now for the second build-out to be installed under a Parish Partnership Scheme.

Mr. Andrew Parsons, Treasurer, attended on behalf of the Tennis Club to discuss the current situation with proposals for additional CCTV cameras on the Playing Field/Pavilion in general and the area close to the Tennis Club, in particular. A full report on the matter is given below.

Updated Information and Matters Arising

Update from North Elmham Living Sustainably (NELS) Group

Mr. Sowinski had spoken with Mr. Ben Earle. Intentions were discussed and any ideas that he may have were requested from him.

Land Management Matters

Village Green: Picnic tables are ready to be put in place – three on the Village Green and one in the Millennium Wood.

Cathedral Ruins: There has been a response to our annual invoice regarding the management fee (£5,355 received). Mrs. Keeble has attempted to contact Alison Naylor, English Heritage, with a view to arranging a meeting. Mr. Sowinski has refurbished the seat that is situated just outside the gate.

Millennium & Jubilee Wood: Correspondence had been received from a parishioner expressing concern for animals, including deer, following some tidying work that is being carried out at the pit in Millennium Wood. This primarily involves tidying the area, and the sensitivity of dealing with wildlife and the environment is acknowledged. The Clerk will respond and the position will be monitored over the coming weeks.

Bridleway on Disused Railway Line and Other Railway Linked Matters: Various work is in the process of being carried out and Mr. Rayner will write to Mr.

Robinson, the Parish Council's liaison contact, regarding a number of matters. Mr. Rayner will also request a copy of the amended deed, which was executed some three years ago, from Breckland Council.

Prince William Wood: A wasp's nest has been disturbed and will be dealt with in the near future.

Allotments: All rents have been collected.

Street Lights

There is a requirement for the installation certificates to be renewed and this will be done by T.T. Jones at an approximate cost of £900. The replacement light in Holt Road is considered to be possibly not necessary, but members will inspect to form views.

Highway Matters

The Village Gates have been installed with 50% of the cost to be covered by Norfolk County Council. The damaged bollards near to the bus stop at the end of Eastgate Street have been reported to Highways Department and scheduled for repair in due course. The broken pedestrian surface leading from Elm Close is not the responsibility of the County Council and has to be viewed as a private matter. The parishioner raising the matter will be advised accordingly. It has been confirmed by Highways Department that the build out near to the doctors' surgery has been correctly installed with no provision for priority of traffic in either direction. This is an intentional feature designed to slow traffic from both directions.

Pavilion and Playing Field

The roof and gutter repairs are to start in the near future. Mr. Sowinski has obtained a price for a Christmas tree which will be in the region of £50. It was agreed by all that a charge of £300 will be made to the District Council in respect of the hiring of the pavilion for the much-awaited Mayoral Election to be held on 7th May, 2026. Miss Ferris produced an excellent

booking form for the Pavilion and it was agreed that some items should be added - the need for hirers to have suitable insurance cover, the reason for hiring the facility and the name of the person with responsibility for the booking.

With regard to the CCTV and Wi-Fi at the Pavilion, the revised proposal is to retain existing DVR and 4 cameras, and supplement with two additional cameras. One new camera with enhanced resolution to monitor the car parking area with the aim that number plate recognition will be improved. One other new camera to be fitted with long range lens and located on the Pavilion directed towards the tennis court/boundary wall. Additionally, a Wi-Fi router to be installed in the Pavilion to enable remote access to the CCTV system to monitor live or captured images as required. Access to the Wi-Fi to be strictly controlled by approved password access in accordance with existing CCTV data protection policy. Full cost will be £500 and is much reduced from previous quotes through re-use of existing equipment and installation carried out without charge with the generous help of a local resident. The Wi-Fi facility will require ongoing monthly cost of up to £20 dependent upon volume of data usage. This solution may require future purchase of larger hard drive within the DVR as more data will be captured and therefore the disk will overwrite old data more frequently. However, this can only be confirmed once established, so provision of a further £100 cost may be required.

Once installed and proven, consideration can be given to install the same solution at the Eastgate Centre with the long-range camera directed towards the children's play area.

Brookside Development update

Positive support from Breckland Council regarding EV charging procedures has unfortunately not been forthcoming, despite being chased. The Chairman has requested support from Mr. Bambridge

with a view to establishing why this is the case. It has been noted that Norfolk County Council have highlighted a success story of installing multiple charging points under 3rd party management in an article by Graham Plant in their latest newsletter. There appears to be an opportunity to share knowledge in the event of Breckland Council being unable to support us.

Defibrillators

Miss Ferris reported that site checks have been carried out.

Local Plan Update

The new consultation has started. The sites have changed from the last phase as predicted, with North Elmham now being expected to provide sites for c.80 houses in the Local Plan instead of the previous c.50. This is due to changes at national government level.

Site NEL 1 which was previously site 205 is for 30 houses, with access onto Eastgate via the demolishing of a bungalow on Eastgate. This site was included in the last version of the draft plan.

Site NEL 2 was put forward in the call for sites as site 330 but wasn't included in the draft plan previously, as a smaller site further to the east on Back Lane would have met our quota, along with site 205 (or the old Station Yard). NEL 2 would have access onto Back Lane and would be for 50 houses.

Breckland have not mentioned or acknowledged our preference for the old Station Yard to be included instead of NEL 1. It is felt that we should press for the removal of NEL 1 and for it to be replaced by the Old Station Yard. Mr. Rayner is to draft comments for next week's meeting and will also place a piece in Elmham News.

New Village Hall

A valuation for the Eastgate Centre is being chased. Another meeting will take place in the near future.

North Elmham Football Club Facilities

Both monthly payments have now been received.

Location Of Skate Ramp and Associated Repairs

There are alternatives for this facility:

i) Leave the ramps in their current position and carry out repairs at a cost of about £5K.

ii) Dispense with the facility and encourage parents to take their children to better equipped alternative sites such as the one in Dereham.

iii) Relocate to another position in the village, e.g. to the village green.

Members are to give this matter consideration with a further discussion to be held at the next meeting.





Apologies for Absence: Mr. N. Markwell, Mr. C. Smith and Mr. G. Bambridge (District Councillor).

Public Participation

Two representatives from the Institute Bowls Club attended with a view to receiving updated information regarding current plans for enhanced CCTV camera coverage. They mentioned that the fence between the tennis and bowls clubs had fallen down which increased the risk of possible vandalism. It was asked if the Parish Council would be prepared to make a contribution to the cost of a replacement fence. The Chairman advised that the Parish Council had discussed sharing responsibility for improved CCTV coverage with the tennis club. However, it transpires that it is not appropriate for us to monitor the tennis club under data protection regulations. The tennis club understands this and indicated they will look at the feasibility of an installation that can be managed by them and would meet the regulations. We are, however, committed to improving the CCTV coverage from the Pavilion including a long-range camera pointing up towards the playing field. It is anticipated this would capture images adjacent to the bowls club. Taken together this should provide an extra deterrent to the type of behaviour we have all had to tolerate.

A parishioner mentioned the leaning wall along the footpath at the Cathedral Ruins. It is the responsibility of English Heritage and we are aware that a representative will be visiting within the next 2/3 weeks.

Two drains in the village are blocked – one on Church Hill and the other on Eastgate Street (opposite number 39).

UPDATED INFORMATION AND MATTERS ARISING

Update from North Elmham Living Sustainably (NELS) Group

Mr. Sowinski had spoken with Mr. Ben Earle who is to formulate some proposals.

A parishioner had previously written to the Parish Council about the pit and concern for deer.

Land Management Matters

Village Green: Concrete bases are to be put down for the picnic tables. Quotations for the concrete are to be obtained. It was decided to wait until spring for the better weather to enable this work to be done.

Cathedral Ruins: Alison Naylor, English Heritage is to visit on the 17th December. A precise time is to be requested.

Cathedral Meadows: Mr. Fitzalan Howard has attempted to obtain four quotations for replacement fencing with two having been received. The preferred option was from Alec Crisp at a cost of £5K (including VAT) and with posts of a life expectancy of 15 years. Acceptance proposed by Mr. Fitzalan Howard and seconded by Mrs. Keeble. All in favour.

Bridleway on disused railway line and other railway linked matters: Mr. Rayner had contacted Breckland Council for a copy of the updated transfer deed. This has been received and will be circulated to all members. The buffers to County School section hadn't been included as a permissive path. An exception is when emergency work or maintenance is needed, in which circumstances it is closed on a temporary basis. Mr. Rayner also raised with Mr. Robinson, Railway Liaison contact, the missing level crossing warning sign and requested the formalisation of a permissive path. He also queried plans for the bridge at the bottom of Church Lane.

Street Lights

The general view is that a replacement light in Holt Road is considered to be not necessary. Drax continues to produce mistakes with the attempted renewal of the contract providing electricity for the street lights. A complaint has, therefore, been lodged. The possibility of solar powered lighting is to be investigated.

Highway Matters

The Village Gates have been installed with 50% of the cost to be covered by Norfolk County Council. No funds have yet been received so the Clerk will chase David Bullock, Senior Programme Technician.

Mr. Gillespie reported that the hedge in Station Road has been cut and the situation is much improved with regard to using the pavement.

Pavilion and Playing Field

A fee of £300 has been advised to Breckland Council for use of the pavilion for next year's election. A socket for outside lighting has been installed. The Christmas tree is due to be delivered on 5th December. The suggested additions to the booking form for the pavilion have been added. An improved CCTV quotation has been obtained and the necessary work will be carried out in due course.

Brookside Development Update

The Chairman has been liaising with Norfolk County Council, (Tommy Lambert, Engineer – Electric Vehicle Infrastructure) regarding EV charging procedures. There is an option to join the Plug in Norfolk network, which is a NCC run chargepoint network.

Defibrillators

Miss Ferris reported that the defibrillator at the surgery is not working and has to be regarded as defunct. It was issued in 2013 and this type is no longer manufactured. The Community Heartbeat Trust has been informed and a price is to be obtained for a new machine.

Local Plan Update

There are two sites in the Draft Plan:-

a) Site NEL 1, which was previously site 205, is for 30 houses, with access onto Eastgate Street via the demolishing of a bungalow on Eastgate Street. This site, which was included in the last version of the draft

plan, is opposed. The proposal is for it to be replaced by the Old Station Yard

b) Site NEL 2 is for 50 houses and is supported.

Appropriate comments will be forwarded to Breckland Council by the deadline of 15th December as responses to the Local Plan consultation process.

New Village Hall

The Chairman stressed the importance of the financial aspects and that the property valuations are crucial. A small working group is to be set up in January, concentrating on financial matters.

Skate Ramp

The three alternatives for this facility were as follows:

- i) Leave the ramps in their current position and carry out repairs at a cost of about £5K.
- ii) Dispense with the facility and encourage parents to take their children to better equipped alternative sites such as the one in Dereham.

Option ii) was agreed (removal of the skate ramp). Proposed by Mr. Sowinski, seconded by Mr. Fitzalan Howard. All in favour.

If you know much about British birds the chances are you will know that the Dipper is a charismatic little bird of stony upland rivers and streams, not a bird you would expect me to be writing about in a piece about the wildlife of an East Anglian village. It's the sort of bird you might hope to see when on holiday in the mountains of the Lake District or Scotland for example, not a bird you would expect to see round here. But this winter we have been fortunate to have a Dipper right here in our parish of North Elmham (photo 1).

If you've been past Bintry Mill (I only just learned that this is still properly spelt with a y unlike the more usual modern spelling of the village of Bintree) this winter then you may have noticed more birdwatchers there than usual. They have come to see the Dipper, a rare visitor to our county.

The Dipper is unique among British birds. They are so-called because of their bobbing action when beside water, often seen when perched on a snag or rock in the middle of a river or stream. It is the only songbird that doesn't just prefer to be around water, but even ventures right into the water (photos 2 and 3). They feed on small aquatic invertebrates and immerse themselves fully into the water and can even swim or walk along the river bed completely below the surface.





Dippers are able to see under water because they have a translucent "eyelid" that they can draw down over their eyes to protect them, called a nictitating membrane. I don't think this is unique to dippers but it is certainly a feature that they make a lot of use of, and you can sometimes see it when they're above water – their eyes look whitish when the membrane is drawn over the eye. Apart from its unusual habits and short tail and stocky shape, the white bib on an otherwise dark brown bird is the most obvious field-mark (photo 4).



Dippers are a rare visitor to Norfolk, usually in winter. These don't come from mountainous regions of the UK, but they are visiting from the Continent, or probably Scandinavia. Dippers vary across their European range in the colour of their underparts. British birds have a lovely chestnut band across the front of the belly just below the white bib (photo 5, taken in Scotland). On Continental birds the belly is more uniformly dark brown or black lacking any chestnut tones. Although they are the same species, these are usually known as Black-bellied Dippers, and when we are lucky enough to see a Dipper in Norfolk it's nearly always a Black-bellied Dipper (there are just two accepted records of British Dipper in Norfolk, both from the 1980s and, unlike the Black-bellied ones, both were in midsummer).



Although several different subspecies are recognised variation is clinal, with birds from the north of their European range tending to be blacker underneath and birds from the south tending to be browner. Some British birds have less chestnut than others, and some



Continental birds can have a hint of chestnut, so it's not always possible to be absolutely sure where a Dipper has originated from. But as nearly all records of Dipper in East Anglia and the south-east have had dark brown or black bellies (photo 6), it's safe to assume that at least the majority have originated from somewhere else in Europe, not the UK.

Of course I cannot guarantee that the Dipper will still be at Bintry Mill by the time you read this, but it's been there for over a month as I write, so there's a good chance it will be. If you go looking for it, its favoured spot is along the stream either side of the white bridge over the road 300m northwest of the mill, but it also gets on the river itself. It disappears some days though, so you might be lucky enough to encounter it elsewhere along the river or feeder streams in the area. Please let me know if you have seen it elsewhere.

A bird I often associate with Dippers is the Grey Wagtail. When I was a teenager I didn't see them in my home area very often but did see them when I was looking for Dippers while on holiday in the Lake District. They like fast-flowing streams and rivers just like Dippers. They're commoner around here than they were for me as a lad and you can see them anywhere in North Elmham, but especially close to the river. The very best place to see them in our parish is around Bintry Mill, where you can find them all year round (photo 7).


The area around Bintry Mill is a fabulous location to look for wildlife, thanks to its owner Paul who seems to do a great job of looking after the land round there. This side of the river is in the parish of



North Elmham and at the moment it is possible to see Grey Wagtail, Great White Egret, Kingfisher, Stonechat, Wigeon and Shoveler, Marsh Harrier, Red Kite and of course the Black-bellied Dipper if you're lucky. Several visitors recently have seen Otters there too and you never know what else you might be lucky enough to come across.

- You can still submit your own request online through Anima as usual, this is our preference as we gain more information which is important to help triage your request.
- Your request will then be sent straight to the Triage team, ensuring it is handled quickly and efficiently.

- Reduced phone queues – less time waiting to speak to someone as Andi can handle multiple calls at the same time.
- Easier to submit a request by phone – no need to go online if that is not convenient or you struggle with the internet/ forms.

- Reduces waiting times and eases pressure on phone lines.

WHAT DID THE VICTORIANS DO FOR US?

The long reign of Queen Victoria (1837-1901) covered a period of immense change, not least in the appearance and condition of country churches and North Elmham's church was no exception. St Mary's, as we see it today, is very much the creation of the Victorians.

The church was served during most of Victoria's reign by two vicars; the Revd Henry Knatchbull, 1833-1867 and the Revd Augustus Legge, 1867-1894. During their time both the exterior and interior of the church was completely transformed, much of it at their own expense.

There are no descriptions of the church before Knatchbull became vicar so we do not know what state it was in when he arrived. The first repairs undertaken in his time involved the repair of the chancel roof in 1836. Later, in 1852, the Norwich church architect, John Brown, was employed to restore the nave roof and the chancel. How dilapidated these areas had become, there is no way of knowing, but the screen behind the altar (the reredos) and the medieval-style stone

seats (sedilia) on the south side of the chancel were his work. Whether the large east window was inserted at this time or later is not clear.

The etching by Robert Ladbrook published in 1843 shows the exterior of the church very much as it is now, except for one very important difference. In 1864 the entire church except for the tower was refaced in 'best Brandon flints' covering the original flint rubble walls. This was an immense undertaking which transformed the exterior appearance of the church. Five new buttresses were built on the north aisle and those to the north chapel were rebuilt. According to the church accounts the cost was £483 partly paid for by a loan of £290 and a further loan from the churchwardens. Other work at the time included reroofing, paid for from the church's endowed estate.

Work also took place in the interior and was described by George Carthew, the antiquarian who visited the church in 1852 and again in 1879. Between these dates the old box pews, some with 'exquisitely-

'carved' bench backs had been removed as well at the Jacobean pulpit (later returned to the church). Some work on reassembling the rood screen had also taken place.

The major alterations to the interior took place under Knatchbull's successor, Augustus Legge. He lived with his wife, Alice and his six children in the old rectory next to the ruins, which formed part of the rectory garden. At the time they were thought to be the remains of a 'Roman station', much modified in medieval times. He was an active clergyman in the parish while at the same time pursuing his antiquarian interests, excavating and stabilising the ruins. He also transcribed and published in 1890 a 16th-century volume of the churchwardens' accounts.

His major works however involved the transformation of much of the interior of the church. He wrote in 1881, 'Ever since I have been incumbent, I have had it in mind to help liberally towards some necessary alterations as soon as I was in a position to do so - that time has now come'. Working with the church architect, Richard Phipson he re-arranged the interior of the church. The 'wretched' western gallery on which the organ had been placed was taken down, revealing the 'magnificent' tower arch. The organ was moved to the north chapel. The pews in the nave and aisles were all re-arranged so that they all faced east.

If we are to believe Carthew, the nave pews date from the early period of restoration under Knatchbull, probably incorporating the much older pew ends with their 15th-century carved ends. However, some are later work with Augustus Legge inserting his own coat of arms in the end of the front pew on the north side of the nave (see illustration). The pulpit and reading desk which had replaced the Jacobean one was removed and the original pulpit returned.

Phipson was pleased that this was possible as 'I am very fond of preserving pulpits of this date'. The intricately-carved choir stalls and the screen around the north chapel were inserted (illustration), and the pieces of the rood screen were assembled and placed across the entrance to the chancel. All this work involved moving Lord Sondes' family box pew in the chancel and the 'retainers' pews to the south chapel. In 1881, Legge wrote to Lord Sondes seeking his approval for the moving of the family pew and asking for a donation towards the cost of the changes, writing that he understood 'the difficulties landowners have at the moment', while hoping for a contribution. The stained glass in the large east window as a memorial to an earlier Lord Sondes was inserted in 1874 and will have transformed the east end of the church.

An important improvement was the installation of the heating system and tiling of the nave and aisle floors. The

heating system has had several new boilers, but otherwise still functions. There is no record of what the previous floor was like, but tiling would have changed the general appearance of the church. The many ledger slabs originally set in the nave floor were re-laid either in the vestry or the east end of the chancel.

The Victorians are often accused of over restoring their churches and destroying their medieval glory. However much of their work at North Elmham was of a very high quality, with the carvings on reading desks in the chancel demonstrating the skills of craftsmen (illustration). The church architect Richard Phipson, who at various times during his career was both the County and Diocesan surveyor, wrote in 1882, 'Your church is so beautiful and grand that it will well repay the work that is proposed to be done'.

Our parish church has gone through many periods of development and change to suit the requirement of every age since its foundation in the 11th century.

Now that we hope the problems of damp have been resolved the time may have come for the 21st century to leave its mark by providing facilities to allow the community role for the building to be further developed.

TIME TO THINK ABOUT OUR FEATHERED FRIENDS

February might seem an unlikely month for garden preparations, but it's actually the perfect time to put up nesting boxes for our local birds. As the days gradually lengthen and spring approaches, many of our garden visitors are already scouting for suitable nest sites, with some species beginning to nest as early as March.

Here in North Elmham, we're fortunate to host a wonderful variety of birds that readily use nest boxes. Blue tits, great tits, and sparrows are the most common users, but with the right boxes, you might also attract robins, wrens, or even treecreepers. The key is getting them up now, giving birds time to discover and inspect them before the breeding season begins in earnest.

When positioning your box, aim for a height of 2-5 metres, ideally facing between north and east to avoid direct sunlight and prevailing wet winds. Ensure there's a clear flight path to the entrance, and avoid placing boxes too close to bird feeders, which can attract predators. A simple wooden box without perches (which only help predators) and with adequate drainage holes is ideal.

The RSPB's website offers excellent guidance on box designs and placement, while Norfolk Wildlife Trust provides information specific to our local species. Your efforts could make a real difference - suitable nesting sites are increasingly scarce, and a well-placed box can be used year after year.

We'd love to see your photos and hear how you get on if you do choose to add some nesting boxes to your garden.

Whether we are people of faith or not, we can probably agree that we should tread on the world lightly as we pass through. We have this extraordinary gift of a beautiful world to live in. Let's do all we can to protect it and care for it, and pass it on in good health to the generations who follow.


