### North Elmham Parish Council Annual Meeting

#### Wednesday 5th May, (via Zoom)

The following information is taken from the Draft PC minutes. The full official minutes can be viewed in the Post Office and on the Community website, once approved.

Councillors Present: Mrs. J. Borgnis (Chairman), Mr. M. Phillips, Mr. B. Gee, Miss A. Ferris, Mr. T. Fitzalan Howard, Mr. P. Grainger, Mrs. A. Keeble, Mr. J. Labouchere, Mr. N. Markwell, Mr. M. Rayner and Mr. C. Smith.

Also in Attendance: Mr. K. Webb (Clerk), Mr. B. Borrett (County and District Councillor), Mr. C. Hill (Elmham News), Mr. I. and Mrs. S. Ball (webmasters) and one parishioner.

#### **Public Participation**

Work has started on the Brookside development and surprise was expressed at the initial disruption. The barns at the front of the site are being demolished and this is to take about a week. The school was aware of this situation. Mr. Rayner is

to contact Orchard Homes to ask them to keep the Parish Council informed of any future impact on pavements and access with information being made available to residents via Elmham News.

Mr. and Mrs. Ball thanked Mr. Markwell for providing his personal information and photograph which have been placed on the website. The Prince Philip book of condolence is to be removed from the website.

#### **Election of Chairman**

Mrs. Borgnis was nominated by Mr. Phillips and seconded by Mr. Labouchere. There were no other nominations. All in favour.

#### **Election of Vice Chairman**

Mr. Phillips was nominated by Mr. Grainger and seconded by Mr. Smith. There were no other nominations. All in favour.

#### **Land Management Matters**

Village Green: Mr. Smith is to chase the quotation in respect of the footpath. The green is generally tidy and the bin is being used. There are still complaints about owners not clearing up after their dogs. Mr. Gee has removed some rubbish and items from the stream.

Cathedral Ruins: Mrs. Keeble has said there have been reports of some children riding bicycles in the ruins.

Cathedral Meadows: Mr. Fitzalan Howard said that the derogation to burn brash is awaited.

collapsed drain, Mr. Rayner confirmed that the land between the Station Road level crossing and the buffers is not included as part of the footpath to which there must be access at all times. Instead, it is covered by a Transport and Works Order.

Mr. Robinson is to ask the Parish Council to inspect the new footpath and fence.

Mr. Rayner has contacted the County Council and requested a pack to proceed with a Public Rights of Way. Nothing has been heard from Breckland Council regarding the Parish Council's response to the request by the MNR for a change in the original covenant.

Mr. Grainger reported the state of the bridleway to Norfolk County Council and they are currently investigating. The Chairman has also sent an e-mail to Mr. Hines, the Highway Engineer, on this matter.

#### **Highway Matters**

Mr. Grainger said that there are three matters which are ongoing:

- There is damage to Holt Road (near the Brookside development) with the centre of the carriageway worn.
- b) The right of way issue.
- c) The cycleway through the village green.

#### **Pavilion and Playing Field**

The reopening of the pavilion will follow government guidelines. The Tennis Club have advised that some of their steps have been damaged and they are thinking of replacing all the steps with a slope. They may ask the Parish Council to make a contribution to the cost of this work but will need to submit financial information to enable this to be considered.

Mr. Smith said that a new loft ladder is needed.

#### **Youth Club Facilities**

Mr. Fitzalan Howard thanked Elmham News for giving details and a reminder. A piece is to be placed on the North Elmham Facebook pages.

#### **Brookside Development Update**

Work has started. Mr. Rayner is to contact Orchard Homes to request future advice on any actions that will have an impact on roads and pavements.

#### **Risk Management**

The Clerk reported that the annual insurance renewal documents had been received. It was agreed by all to proceed with the policy for a further year. The Clerk is to contact the brokers to confirm that volunteers undertaking work on behalf of the Parish Council are suitably covered.

#### **Defibrillators**

Miss Ferris has been in touch with the Community Heartbeat Trust and identified some of the volunteers. There have been mixed reactions from parishioners and it seems as training needs to be put in place. The Chairman and Miss Ferris are to discuss this matter and carry out some more research with a view to a further assessment being done at the next meeting.

#### **Village Litter Pick**

This matter is to be placed on hold. Some people are already litter picking. The Chairman is to put a piece in Elmham News.

#### **Village Green Tree Planting Proposal**

Mr. Grainger has passed details of this matter to Mr. Borrett.

#### Overview of Parish Council Financial Situation

Messrs Phillips and Grainger had considered the position in respect of the Parish Council's two loans with the Public Works Loan Board. The Clerk had also discussed the matter with Natasha John-Phillip, Business Operations Manager. The loan in respect of streetlights has an outstanding balance of £9,977 with just three years remaining.

The village green loan is due to be repaid in November 2062. The fixed interest rate is 4.17% and the original loan was rescheduled in 2014 with an opening balance of £35,000. The current balance is £24,737 but the amount required to pay the loan now would be £41,590. Effectively, a penalty interest charge of almost £17,000 would be made. It was agreed by all to take no action and to retain the loans in their current form with the existing repayment structure.

The Parish Council has a significant balance on the current account, and it was agreed to ring fence certain funds as follows:

- (a) £15K to cover potential legal fees for CANT (three years x £5K).
- (b) £33K in respect of the funds received for agreeing to the telephone mast (£40K originally to be spent over a period of 25 years).
- (c) A sum, to be assessed, to cover youth activity and a Building Reserve Fund for a new village hall.

The above action was proposed by Mr. Grainger and seconded by Mrs. Keeble. All in favour.

Mr. Fitzalan Howard reported that a leak had been discovered at the top end of the playing field (near the wall) and Anglian Water had been out to rectify the problem. The Clerk had received an assurance from Anglian Water that they would visit on a regular basis to read the meters. They had not been able to read the playing field meter in late December as a large hose had been stored next to the meter preventing access.

#### **George Kerrison, MBE**

George Kerrison owned the shop which is now the Tea Post and Post Office. The shop had been in the Kerrison ownership for nearly 80 years before he sold it in 1968.

His grandfather Robert Kerrison took on the ownership of the shop – he came from Tittleshall, where he had been a grocer and draper. He is recorded in the 1881 Census as living at Tittleshall but in the 1891 recorded as living at the Stores, Chapel Road (Holt Road).

Whatever you wanted or needed, Kerrison's shop would have it. Whether you needed bacon, butter, currants, cheese or some wool for a cardigan, you would find it there and if you listened carefully you would also hear the latest gossip around the village!

George was Elmham, like a stick of rock, he had our village running through his bones! He lived in the village all his life but was away from 1939 – 1947 serving in the RAF Medical Corps, mainly in the African desert. He was a stalwart of 99% of Elmham associations, the British Legion, The Institute, the Elmham News ,Playing Field Association and many more we know but can't think of at the moment.

He was a Parish Councillor, and also Chairman of the Parish Council for many years. He was a District Councillor from 1971 (then the old Mitford and Launditch RDC) until he retired from that in 1991. He was the member for Elmham, Bintree, Twyford, Guist and Gateley.

For all his work in local Councils he was awarded the MBE in 1997.

However we remember George best after he had retired. Now, like Jimmy ,years later, we remember George with his wheelbarrow and broom and hoe, busily going around the village, sweeping up where he thought it looked untidy. He didn't stop to think 'Oh dear, I hadn't

better do this as I might offend someone who feels I am doing somebody else out of a job'. He swept pavements, cleaned out drains, picked up litter, pulled weeds up – you name it and he did it! We think that's where he heard all the gossip first hand!

What a pity Elmham looks so scruffy - and we don't have a man with a barrow and a broom, and a few hours to spare each week.

#### North Elmham Cricket Team 1887

I recently received an email from Cornelia Bidewell who sent a cricketing photograph of 1887 for the Archives. Cornelia went on to say that there was a 'stuck' drawer at Grange Farm, which she could never open but was determined that the time was right to use brute force and get it open – which she did and found the cricketing photograph.

Thinking about this image I went to look in our Archives and found that we have that same photograph too.

At the bottom of the photograph were some of the names of those posing in the picture, one cricketer in the back row had turned sideways! He obviously didn't want to be in it!

The names at the bottom only had initials for the first names, several of them were

Kerrisons, so I sent the image via email to Diana Dann, George Kerrison's daughter. She was delighted to receive the photo and has filled in the correct first names for the Kerrison family and also their ages.

I think the wall behind the team in the photograph is the curved wall of the Shrubbery at Tom and Jo Fitzalan Howard's home. We know the cricketers did use the estate for matches when it belonged to Lord Sondes. The Green Field wasn't used for football and cricket until the 20th Century, cattle used it instead!

What a surprise this has been. I have tried looking at the 1890 Census to fill out the history of all of them if I can. However, without something else to corroborate what the Census says I don't know anything about them. As in all communities especially rural ones there are usually several families with the same surname and first names which can send you on a false trail.

#### **Dialect Today**

Living on a farm as a young child, with old men the workforce just after the War, the speech that I heard would have been incomprehensible to an outsider. What would they have made of 'oil ding yar lug if yew don't git orff that sac o corn', to me a skinny little girl in wellie boots, (I lived in boots) with cuts and scratches after playing in the hedgerows and strawstacks.

Actually, I often say to my Grandson, at eighteen he is nearly 6 feet tall,' Boy I'll ding your lug' but he knows I can't reach his lug anymore. I tell him that I say that, so he remembers his roots!

Father was the horseman on the farm. There were a number of big Shire horses used for pulling carts and tumbrils and I loved them to bits. I'd go up to them and they would lower their heads and blow down their noses at me. Father would say 'jest yew mind them clodhoppers, theyl meake yew into mincemeat if they walk on yew'.

You talk the way you hear others talk, you copy, and when you are small you don't know anything about accents or dialect, and you wouldn't care anyway. However, if you leave home and go to live in another part of the country it is an eye opener. Suddenly you can't understand what some people are saying and they can't understand your thick accent either.

Now there is a Dialect Society here in Norfolk and sometimes there is a call for someone who is part of that society to be the dialect coach for TV or films. Apparently, our dialect or accent is hard to sound exactly right.

Isn't it a shame that TV and films are changing the way we speak and computers also. Our dialect is dying out, it is being watered down by correctly speaking people on the television though there are some people from Yorkshire or other parts of the North who are managing to be presenters. Nice to hear them.



#### **Mental Wellbeing**

As part of our commitment to the wellbeing of our children, staff, and wider school community, I am proud to advise you that we will be launching the Five Ways to Wellbeing Project in our school.

#### **Enrichment Surprises**

Miss Ludlow commenced our new term by sharing the story: The Go Away Bird by Julia Donaldson & Catherine Rayner. This story is about a bird that just wants to be left alone, but the other birds are keen to talk and play with her. When she finds herself in trouble, she soon realises that everyone needs their friends. This book is based on how important friendship is. Miss Ludlow used a parrot puppet to act as her friend. In the second half of the enrichment the children made friendship bracelets for friends in their class. The context of the story also reinforced our focus on the value of "Forgiveness" this half term, which Ms Jones launched in collective worship on the first Monday back.

Mrs Otty has read The Butterfly Inside by Serena Lane Ferrari. This story is about determination, growth mindset and using friends to support any problems encountered. Oli, an Elf, wants to transform into a butterfly. He is determined that he will be able to fly like a butterfly and doesn't listen to those who mock and laugh at him. He asks his friends to help him achieve his goal. With determination and help he succeeds. Mrs Otty had a wind up butterfly hidden in a card which the teachers released at the end of the story. Some of the children took the butterflies outside at break and watched them fly in the wind. All children made a masquerade mask to show what was inside them - their short term and long term goals.

#### **North Elmham Ofsted**

During the last week of lockdown for us in school settings, we received an Ofsted inspection. Suffice to say it was remarkable in that it was virtual but no less intense and thorough in its inspection. I was especially proud of my school staff, LA, governors and children who contributed to the inspection. I can share the outcome with you all "Having considered all the evidence and taking into account the impact of COVID-19 on the school, I am of the opinion that at this time: Leaders and those responsible for governance are taking effective action to provide education in the current circumstances." The letter is on the school website.

#### Class News

Sheep class have really loved learning all about the Great Fire of London so far this term in their history lessons. Having started the unit by being history detectives and scrutinising the primary source materials, children have since been finding out about why the fire spread so quickly and what methods were used to try and control the fire. Samuel

Pepys' diary has been a great source of information for this! The class decided that the strong winds and the fact that the houses were made of wood were probably the most important reasons. They did not agree that creating firebreaks by pulling down buildings was a good idea, because they thought it was mean of the rich people to make the poorer people go homeless. We were very impressed by their independent thoughts on all of this!

We have also now started writing our own stories in English about an escape from the great fire (or another type of disaster!), inspired by the beautiful book we have been reading: 'The Great Fire of London' by Emma Adams:

In science, we decided that we needed to find the firefighters some better equipment ("They'll get so wet using those old water carts!"), so we are going to be testing some materials to see if they are waterproof or absorbent and then decide which would be suitable for making a fireman's suit.

For Mental Health Awareness Week, Whales had a circle time discussion about ways to look after our mental health. We also talked about how we could support others by simply offering a listening ear! We discussed what we could say to someone who needed somebody to talk to. Some of us wrote messages of support and encouragement, whilst others suggested trusted adults we could turn to.

In other areas of the curriculum, Whales have been busy identifying and classifying living things. We searched for microhabitats in our local grounds and used classification keys to group them. We have also started to learn about the location of rainforests and the different layers. In Design Technology, we have been learning to make pop out folds and exploring different techniques. We look forward to making our own books for Sheep class!

#### **Fruit Picking**

If you lived here in Elmham from the summers of the early 1950's up to the late 1960's, you would have known where to go to earn a few pennies to supplement the family finances for school uniforms, or shoes for school in September. If you were a mum at home, with a bike, you could take your pick of where to go. You would have known what fruit was ripe first and where was the best place to go! Out would come the Thermos flask and a battered tin for sandwiches, pump up the tyres and off you would go.

Here in the village, there was always the blackcurrant season from June onwards, at Air Vice Marshall Don's estate. The field of currants stretched from the side of the wood near the present footpath, across to the new line of trees today (actually the footpath in the 50's and 60's went through the wood in a wavy line, the present footpath was instigated much later).

Everyone had lightweight baskets to fill – sorry can't remember the weight you were supposed to put in the basket. When weighed if you were overweight, some of the currants would be taken out and given back to you in an empty basket as a starter for the next one.

All the pickers had to be finished by 4.00 pm as the lorry came to transport the currants to Tunstead. I believe they went to a Ribena factory somewhere near Great Yarmouth.

Later on the estate grew blackberries for a number of seasons instead of blackcurrants.

When Mr Robin Don took over the running of the estate, being a Master of Wine, he had a vineyard planted opposite the Dovecote and also in front of the church (more about that another time).

If you didn't mind a bike ride Gorgate Hall also had black currants, now machine picked but in the 50's /60's it was all done by hand. I can also remember sometime

in the 1950's as a young teenager biking there to pick French beans, a back breaking job as you had to bend over all the time you were picking.

Whilst at Billingford, the Parfitt family had strawberries to be picked. Fine if not too squishy, then you had the straw which was around the plants to wipe your hands in and clean them. Wherever you might be picking soft fruit, if the fruit was handled too much or squeezed you were always told in no uncertain terms not to do it again!!

If you fancied biking to Bintree, the Howard family had gooseberries earlier in the season – you definitely needed long gloves picking these as gooseberry bushes are cruel!

Simon Thompson became the new owner of Foxburrow Farm in 1972. Some of his acreage was given over to soft fruit, strawberries and blackberries. Rhubarb was also grown for a few seasons but I can't remember how it was picked. I am presuming it was probably done by the

regular team of women who worked there full time,

If you were a regular summer picker of soft fruit, and you get a whiff of strawberries or blackcurrants now you are immediately taken back to those fruit fields. Not unpleasant smells, but truly evocative of a different time.

Most of the workforces were women, the only time they were working whilst being Mum at home. They all worked very hard, were wonderful workers - but if you quietly walked down the rows the gossip was wonderful. As a child you learned a lot... most of which you couldn't understand!!

#### **Those 1940's-70's Kids**

The following was sent to us in April, 2007, by Norman Lowe, sent to him by William Drew who grew up in Elmham before emigrating to Australia. It seems even more apt today than it did in 2007.

Congratulations to ALL the kids who were born in the 1940's, 50's,60's or 70's. First we survived being born to mothers who smoked and/or drank while they carried us. They took aspirin, ate blue cheese dressing, tuna from a can, and didn't get tested for diabetes.

Then after that trauma, our baby cots were covered with bright coloured lead-based paints. We had no childproof lids on medicine bottles, doors or cabinets and when we rode our bikes, we had no helmets, not to mention, the risks we took hitchhiking.

As children we would ride in cars with no seat belts or air bags. Riding in the back of vans - loose -was always great fun.

We drank water from the garden hosepipe and not from a bottle. We shared one soft drink with four friends, from one bottle and no-one actually died from this.

We ate cakes, white bread and real butter and drank pop with sugar in it, but we weren't overweight because we were always outside playing! No one was able to reach us all day. And we were ok.

We would spend hours building our go carts out of scraps and then ride down the hill, only to find out we forgot the brakes. After running into the bushes a few times, we learned how to solve the problem.

We did not have Playstations, Nintendos, X-Boxes, no video games at all, no 99 channels on cable, no video tape movies, no surround sound, no cell phones, no text messaging, no personal computers or internet chatrooms. We had friends and we went outside and found them!!

We fell out of trees, got cut, broke bones and teeth and there were no lawsuits from these accidents. We played with worms and mud pies from dirt, and the worms did not live in us for ever. Made up games with sticks and tennis balls and although we were told it would happen, we did not poke out any eyes.

We rode bikes or walked to a friend's house and knocked on the door or rang the bell, or just yelled for them!

Local teams had tryouts and not everyone made the team. Those who didn't had to learn to deal with disappointment. Imagine that!!

The idea of a parent bailing us out if we broke the law was unheard of. They actually sided with the law!

This generation has produced some of the best risk-takers, problem solvers and inventors ever!

The past 50 years have been an explosion of innovation and new ideas.

We had freedom, failure, success and responsibility and we learned how to deal with it! And if you are one of them, congratulations!

But being a 40's child and living here in Elmham I can say... we also swam in the river, no adults in sight, dived off the bridge, played in the road (thankfully no one has tried that here today), rode bikes with no brakes, nor tread on the tyres - and lived to tell the tale!

We didn't realise at the time, but this was Utopia.









#### Wildlife at the Cathedral Meadows

What a cold month it's been! Officially the coldest April in almost 100 years and this has had an impact on the wildlife. A northerly airflow throughout the month meant spring migrants were slow to arrive. I'm pleased to say Cuckoos have now arrived back, later than usual, but I've only seen one Swallow and no House Martins or Swifts at the meadows yet, although small numbers are back elsewhere in North Elmham now. Whitethroats (photo 1) made it back eventually and a Lesser Whitethroat has been singing in one of the hedges.

The cold, often frosty nights have meant it's been a really poor spring for moths. There was one relatively warm night recently so I took the opportunity to head to the meadows with some lights and found a half-decent selection of moths for the first time this year. The first moth I found was a Mullein (photo 2), a large and striking moth that's named after the Mullein plant which its young feed on. You can often see the caterpillars on the Mullein leaves along the railway in the summer, but the Mullein grows right in the path of where the railway company spray weedkiller and most of the caterpillars presumably get killed along with the plants just before they are ready to pupate. This area didn't get sprayed last year so I was hoping I might have a better chance of finding an adult this year, and so it proved. Other moths that night included a Great Prominent (photo 3) – an even larger and relatively scarce moth and a Dotted Chestnut, a species that was first seen in south Norfolk as recently as 2013 and, over the next five or six years started to colonise the entire county.

One of our less conspicuous ladybirds is the 16-spot Ladybird (photo 4). It's quite distinctive but being a dull yellow colour and quite a bit smaller than the more familiar red 7-spot Ladybird, it's harder to spot. I occasionally see them, but rarely more than two or three at a time. Earlier this week I walked up the north side of the meadows and noticed an unusually large group of 16-spot Ladybirds on one Dandelion flower and more on another. I started looking more carefully and there were hundreds of them! Eventually I counted 3,037 individual ladybirds though I'm quite sure I didn't see half of them - I wouldn't mind betting the true number present that morning was over 10,000. There were a number of other insects feeding on the Dandelions too – in fact the vast majority of pollinating insects I've seen this spring have been attending Dandelions. It's time we stopped thinking of Dandelions as weeds and started celebrating them as one of our most important wildflowers for insects. And yes, that includes the ones in your lawns! We can survive without perfectly manicured sterile green outdoor carpets but we can't survive without insects, and many of our important pollinating insects are declining at an alarming rate. Dandelions are especially valuable in early spring when there are relatively few other pollen sources available for insects to feed on.

Ladybirds are types of beetles but tend to get a more favourable reception than other types of beetle. I found a few different beetles at the meadows recently including some flea beetles, a group of insects with large rear thighs encasing big muscles that enable them to jump like fleas. One of the flea beetles I found was a tiny but striking little creature, black with two broad yellowish stripes down its wing cases. The Small Striped Flea Beetle (photo 5) is supposed to be quite common but it was the first time I've found one

It's nice to see a few more wildflowers coming out now and one that I was especially pleased to find was Rue-leaved





Saxifrage (photo 6). It's not a rare flower but I found it growing on the chapel ruins when I first started the wildlife survey in April 2018 and haven't been able to find it there since. Well it turns out it's smaller than I'd remembered, so maybe I've been overlooking it, but in any case it was nice to find it again after a couple of blank years. It's a lovely little plant, a beautiful white flower on a red stem above a rosette of reddish green leaves with oddly-shaped lobes surrounded by a rim of sticky white hairs.





Also, to remember and include everyone not just those attending church, but to understand and respect everyone's personal feelings around faith, different faiths or no faith. So perhaps the time is right to do something differently. So, what will be changing or not?
