GARDENING CLUB

In September we welcomed Jane Steward as our speaker to talk about Medlars. Most of us had vaguely heard the name but were totally ignorant about them but we were about to be educated in the nicest possible way by the charming Jane.

The medlar is a very old fruit probably from around the Black or Caspian Sea and was probably brought over here by the Romans. Henry VIII was a huge fan, so they were a high class fruit and much sought after.

It is a first cousin of the Quince, also a much-underrated fruit and is usually grafted onto the hardy stock of the hawthorn

Jane and her husband moved to Norfolk with a young medlar tree (a wedding present) to a rural property and her love affair began. She started her business, "The Eastgate Larder" selling jelly and chutneys in 2016 and now has the National Collection of Medlars consisting of 115 trees.

The fruit looks unusual and has acquired some odd names over the centuries, small and brown – cul de chien in French!

We were all offered a taste of raw medlar, with mixed reactions depending on taste buds.

Medlar Jelly is best eaten with cheese, and her spicy chutney could be eaten with meats etc. Many members took jars home with them as gifts.

Jane chose an exquisite rose called "Eyes for You" as the Flower of the Month which was brought by Dawn.

Our October meeting will have been the story of "Essence" of Stanfield which makes preserves, chutneys etc. Another opportunity to taste before buying. Our November meeting on Thursday 27th will be our Christmas Social when we invite members to bring a small plate of food and a wrapped packet of seeds. Fear not, we will provide the wine. Looking forward to seeing everyone.

In science, we have been learning all about the human body. We began by looking closely at the external parts of our bodies, and we are now beginning to think about what's inside too. It was a wonderful opportunity for everyone to pause, reconnect, and celebrate the importance of mental health.

Children in Oak class visited the Norwich Cathedral. We learnt about the Benedictine Monks who lived at there until the Reformation and the dissolution of the monastery in 1538. COUNTY SCHOOL STATION

County School Station has had a slightly slower season this year, as major changes to the main Mid-Norfolk Railway catering arrangements were being completed at Dereham. With these now in place, and a volunteer team keen to get things running smoothly, we hope that the Tea Room will be opening more reliably in 2026!

Despite the temporary setback caused by these changes, we've had an otherwise excellent season - welcoming many new and returning faces - many of whom have enjoyed a ride on the Wensum Valley Miniature Railway. An exciting donation, now on display at the station, has been the original design drawings for "North Elmham's New Station (County School)" - showing the layout of the track and signals for the junction. The station platform border garden has also become a delight, thanks to our volunteers, who have replanted much of the bed, created an art installation using wood from a fallen apple tree, an impressive "bug hotel" and replaced the edging bricks protecting the surface of the platform from erosion and tidying the location! Work is also happening on our Victorian railway carriage, which is now protected from the elements by a period-style roof.

At the moment we're in the middle of our orchard harvest in what has turned out to be a bit of a Mast Year. The Station Orchard is a working orchard, with the fruit being pressed for juice that is bottled and sold to raise important funds for our charity. A percentage of the crop is allowed to drop - providing food for animals that live on the site as they prepare for the winter months. We're happy for people to take some of these windfalls for their own, personal, use - but do ask people not to pick any of the crop from the trees! We are also looking into expanding the orchard in the coming years, with both hard and soft fruit being

grown for sale. If anyone would be keen on joining our team and helping with this, they'd be very welcome!

There has also been a lot of interest in, and support for, our 'Back To School' appeal, which is part of the ongoing efforts being made to restore the railway line between County School, Elmham and Dereham to regular passenger use.

The first phase of this scheme aims to raise £30,000 to complete some essential work at the County School end of the line. This includes replacing the missing track in the old Wroxham bay platform and moving the Tea Room into new accommodation in a suitable railway vehicle that will be parked on this track, in addition to making some more improvements to the footpath that will be retained alongside the restored line. To date, we have raised over £22,000 towards this, and work is due to start in the very near future.

There will also be work resuming at the old North Elmham station site, where the existing track layout is to be simplified, with spare material removed, ready for future developments. A temporary level crossing gate, which will serve until we complete planned level crossing work at this site, is also intended to be provided to replace the damaged one on the southern side of the crossing.



FAKENHAM CHORAL SOCIETY

Christmas Concert

Fakenham Choral Society's popular Christmas Concert will take place in Fakenham Parish Church on Saturday 13th December at 5.30pm. The concert will include Benjamin Britten's Saint Nicolas and Vivaldi's short and lively Magnificat, together with other festive music performed by the choir and the chance for audience participation in some familiar and well-loyed carols.

Although the Britten and the Vivaldi have contrasting styles, both have strong associations with Christmas. The Magnificat uses Mary's words of praise that she would be the mother of Jesus.

St. Nicolas famously became the Santa Claus much celebrated in Europe, and better known to us as Father Christmas. Britten's work tells the life story of St. Nicolas through a series of vivid episodes. It begins with his miraculous birth, described as an answer to prayer, followed by his early devotion to God. The narrative continues with his calming of a storm during a journey to Palestine, his appointment as Bishop of Myra, and the legendary rescue of the "pickled boys." It concludes with his imprisonment and a celebration of his long life filled with piety and miraculous deeds.

The concert is free entry on a first come first serve basis with doors opening at 4.45pm. Once church capacity is reached we will have to turn people away. There will be a retiring collection at the end.

During the interval there will be wine and soft drinks to purchase and free mince pies to enjoy.

A green new years resolution that stuck

In 2020 I set myself a challenge - buy all my clothes second hand for the year. Little did I know that within weeks, heading to the shops would be off the cards anyway. But lockdown or not, that resolution changed how I shop for good.

It was the year I discovered Vinted. The app that made hunting for pre-loved clothes easy, genuinely fun, and yes - a bit addictive (watch out for that algorithm).

I sailed through that year-long challenge. My star find was a silky high-end dress for £30 that I wore to three weddings before I sold it on for... £30.

As this became my new norm I found myself less and less tempted by new things and began buying a lot less in general. I also sold items myself and now spend very little on clothes per year.

Why does this matter?

The fashion industry pumps out 10% of global carbon emissions - more than international flights and shipping combined. Making one cotton t-shirt guzzles 2,700 litres of water - that's what you'd drink over two and a half years. A shocking £140 million worth of clothes end up in UK landfills each year.

Yes, there's a carbon cost to posting parcels around the country. But the emissions are tiny compared to manufacturing something new, shipping it from overseas, and trucking it to a warehouse.

Buying second hand keeps cash circulating between real people instead of flowing straight to corporate pockets. It's the circular economy in action. Though let's be honest - Vinted (a tech company worth billions) takes a slice of every sale. Still, the bulk goes to whoever's clearing out their wardrobe.

Charity shops? Obviously brilliant. Your money supports good causes and nothing beats a proper rummage. But finding exactly what you need, in your size, isn't always easy.

My tried-and-tested tips

Stick with brands you know. If you're a reliable size 12 in M&S, buy M&S. Takes the guesswork out.

Go looser for experimental buys. It's less risky to try something more fun with oversized jumpers, baggy tees, open cardigans etc.

Patience pays off. Favourite items you like and the app learns your taste. You'll spot bargains before they shoot up in price. Don't be shy about making cheeky offers either.

Avoid dodgy photos. Blurry pictures and bad lighting hide a multitude of sins.

Zoom right in. Check for bobbling, stains, and wear - even on items marked "very good condition". People's standards vary wildly.

Shop in reverse. Browse regular shops for styles you like, then search for them on Vinted at a fraction of the price.

Buy ahead of the season. Want summer items? Start looking in Spring before prices shoot up and availability drops.

PS. This isn't an advert for Vinted (IoI). Other pre-loved services are available. I am sharing my experience to perhaps inspire or encourage. Reducing my consumption has been really liberating - my wardrobe is smaller, tidier and it's easier to pick an outfit in the morning.



ELMHAM WILDLIFE





This month I am writing about a bird that I imagine everyone who reads this article will be familiar with, the Blackbird. I think most of you will recognise at least an adult male Blackbird, with its smart black plumage and bright yellowy-orange bill and eye-ring (photo 1).



You probably also know or have noticed that not all Blackbirds are black. Females and young males are brown, though quite variable in the detail of their appearance. Typically their bills are duller, though these become more yellow as the young birds mature, and on some adult females (photo 2) it can be almost as bright as the adult males. Less mature birds tend to have darker bills (photo 3).



Younger juvenile Blackbirds tend to be paler below with a more speckled breast (photo 4), and these are sometimes mistaken for other species of thrush, especially Song Thrush (photo 5).

With around 5 million pairs breeding in the UK, Blackbirds are one of our commonest birds and easy to find in many different habitats including gardens. But this may not always be the case. The population of Blackbirds in southern England has crashed over the last few years and this has been linked to the Usutu virus. This virus was first detected in the UK in birds in London in 2020, and since then has spread across south-east England with cases from Dorset to Cambridgeshire. The virus has been in mainland Europe for 30 years and it's northward spread is linked to









climate change, as with a number of other tropical diseases some of which also affect humans.

The Usutu virus is carried by a species of mosquito that normally bites birds rather than humans (apparently it can also bite humans on occasion, but humans who are infected with the virus are often asymptomatic). Here in Norfolk our Blackbirds may already have started to be affected as a number of people have commented on how they seem to be declining, but it seems very likely that this decline will accelerate over the next few years. This doesn't mean we will lose all of our Blackbirds. For some of our declining species, extinction is inevitable, but I don't think that's the case with Blackbirds - at least not yet!

Most of our breeding Blackbirds are relatively sedentary, staying in the same area throughout the year, although a few migrate south or west to the Continent or Ireland. Millions more Blackbirds migrate to the UK for the winter, having bred in southern Scandinavia or in northwest Continental Europe. Lots of these winter here in Norfolk, but many more pass through Norfolk on their way to spend the winter elsewhere in the country, and then again on their return journey in spring.

Migrating thrushes are a feature of October and November (and, especially when prompted by cold weather on the Continent, later into the winter too). These include Redwings and Fieldfares which often come over in large flocks, but also Song Thrushes and Blackbirds which typically migrate in smaller groups or alone. They set off in the evening and migrate overnight, but depending on weather conditions (all along their journey) you can often see them





continuing their migration overhead in the mornings (photo 6). Those that pitch in can often be seem in small groups especially around hedgerows where they feed on berries (photo 7).

A similar but rarer thrush that often migrates through Norfolk is the Ring Ouzel. I've not found one in North Elmham yet, though I have seen one just outside in Billingford. They are similar to Blackbirds but have scalier plumage, silvery flight feathers and a variable white or pale band across their chest. Adult males are very distinctive, but young birds can be trickier. Sometimes Blackbirds also show a similar white area on their chest (photo 8) which can lead to them being misidentified as the scarcer species.

Come early spring, before the wintering birds have all departed, our resident Blackbirds will be beginning to sing to advertise their territories and attract a mate (photo 9). They have such a beautiful song and if they do decline significantly then they will be greatly missed if only for their singing. Contrary to the Beatles song "Blackbird" (which features Blackbird song) they don't usually sing "in the dead of night", but they are one of the first birds to sing in the morning, starting when it's only just beginning to get light.

Blackbirds are deeply embedded in our culture, for example did you know that the colly birds of the Twelve Days of Christmas referred to Blackbirds? Apparently 'colly' meant black as coal. You'll remember that the famous "Song of Sixpence" rhyme refers to "Four and twenty blackbirds baked in a pie" and maybe like me you thought that was quite an odd choice of meat to have in your pie. Well apparently the Blackbirds were actually placed in the top of a very large





pie after it had been baked, and when the dish was brought out to the dinner party the lid was removed so they flew out as a way of entertaining the guests.

Do you see as many Blackbirds as you used to? I would be interested to hear from you if you have noticed them more or less than you did in the past. 

Of course, the story behind Bonfire Night tells a different story of treachery and treason. Perhaps the most significant thing is that we remember it (and the rhyme), even if we look back through rather rose-tinted glasses.

Remembrance has become a lasting theme throughout November. We begin the month with All Saints Day and All Souls Day, remembering not only the "red letter" Saints, but all those who have meant so much to us but now live on another shore.

It's a time to pause, give thanks for their lives and to cherish our memories.

Remembrance Sunday always falls on the second Sunday of November, the nearest Sunday to Armistice Day, 11th November. In 1919, the first official Armistice Day event was held in the grounds of Buckingham Palace, with a two-minute silence as a mark of respect for those who died in the war and those left behind. It was in 1921 that the Royal British Legion started selling poppies to raise funds for ex-servicemen.

It is a sad reflection on humanity that the so-called "war to end all wars" proved not to be so.

Today, as well as honouring British service personnel past and present, Remembrance Sunday is also an opportunity to reflect on conflicts around the world; the dreadful impact they have on so many lives; and to pray for lasting peace.

Before we know it, we will be celebrating Christmas, when we rejoice once more that Jesus, the Prince of Peace, came into the world as one of us. True peace comes not from the laying down of arms, but from a personal relationship with Jesus as Son of God and Light of the World.


