NORTH ELMHAM PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

WEDNESDAY 6TH SEPTEMBER

The following information is taken from the Draft PC minutes and may be expanded where the Editors feel more explanation is necessary. The full official minutes can be viewed in the Post Office and on the Community website, once approved.

Councillors Present Were: Mrs. J. Borgnis (Chairman), Mr. M. Phillips, Miss A. Ferris, Mr. T. Fitzalan Howard, Mr. B. Gee, Mr. P. Grainger, Mrs. A. Keeble, Mr. J. Labouchere, Mr. N. Markwell, Mr. M. Rayner and Mr. C.Smith

Also in Attendance: Mr. K. Webb (Clerk), Mr. G. Bambridge (District Councillor), Ms. L. Varney (Breckland Council) and two parishioners.

Apologies for absence: None

Updated Information & Matters Arising

Land Management Matters

Village Green: The "young people" who frequent the Village Green and other parts of the neighbourhood now tend to congregate near the Eastgate Street gates. We are aware that the police have been visiting some houses in the area. NGF will inspect some of the play equipment items which have been damaged.

Mr. Phillips reported that one of the trees needs reducing by 50% (near number 43) and the cost for this work will be about £800. A much smaller tree (an offshoot) next door (near numbers 41 and 41a) needs to be removed completely at a cost of about £350. At a later date, work will be required on seven other trees (cost £3,300) which will produce a total spend of £4,450. This was proposed by Mr. Phillips and seconded by Mr. Gee. (All in favour except Mr. Labouchere who abstained).

The hedges are due to be cut and the Cathedral Close gully has recently been cleared out by jetting.

Two NGF Play quotations have been received in respect of work needed following the RoSPA inspections - £186 + VAT and £345 + VAT. Mrs. Keeble proposed that this important work should be carried out, seconded by Mr. Smith. All in favour.

Cathedral Ruins: Mrs. Keeble said that extra work had been carried out in August. The mobile mower has not yet paid a visit and will be chased. The new bench is due to arrive on 8th September.

Cathedral Meadows: A payment of £953.84 has been received under the Basic Payment Scheme from the Rural Payments Agency.

Broom Green: Mr. Labouchere said that a small local team is being formed in order to keep the weeds away on an ongoing basis.

Millennium Wood and Jubilee Wood:Some thinning is needed in Jubilee Wood.
Nick Saunders is to be asked to have a look.

Church Meadow: Mr. Fitzalan Howard said that a trench along the west side of the field to drain water from the church across the meadow had been suggested. Some work would be needed to cut back trees, branches, a hedge, grass and brambles. Two quotations had been received - £450 to do the work by hand and £425 to use a digger and flail. All brash and bits will be smashed by flail and left ready to be dug out. Any waste disposal required is included.

Acceptance of the lower quote (£425) was proposed by Mr. Labouchere and seconded by Mr. Markwell. All in favour.

Allotments

Mr. Phillips reported that there is one person on the waiting list. Changeover date is 11th October.

Street Lights

Mr. Markwell confirmed that Jones Electrical have been appointed as our new contractors. The Clerk will ensure that all necessary documentation is returned to them.

Highway Matters

A police safety camera was recently deployed in the village.

Pavilion and Playing Field

Mr. Smith reported that CCTV cameras are in operation and have already proved to be of use. A number of youngsters are out at midnight and parents have been informed. There has been no further damage to the pavilion or litter left in that area.

Call For Sites Update

Mr. Rayner is going to attend the updating of the Local Plan preview session at Dereham Town Council on 13th September. Filigree Communications has been appointed to lead the community consultation to gather views on the new Local Plan. There has still been no response from Sarah Suggitt (Breckland Council) to Mr. Rayner's email sent in June and the subsequent chaser sent on 17th August. At the recent meeting of CANT, Jerome Mayhew, MP for Broadland, confirmed that he was completely behind the views previously expressed by George Freeman MP. Unfortunately, we have seen nothing in print that supports this so the Clerk will chase.

Annual Budget

Attention needs to start being made to budget considerations for next year.

CGM Group and Grounds Maintenance For 2024

The Clerk has contacted Norse and invited them to tender for next year's contract.

Community Car Scheme

Lorraine Varney, Community Enabler from Breckland Council, attended to give details of the Community Car Scheme which a parishioner had suggested, at a previous Parish Council meeting, could be considered as a potentially useful resource for the village. It has not yet been advertised. There are currently 13 schemes in the District and they run annually from

April to March, relying on volunteers such as coordinators and drivers. Grants ranging from £250 to £6,500 can be obtained to set up schemes but funding is not available to Parish Councils. It was stressed that volunteers are absolutely key to the success of the scheme.

Foxley runs a scheme in conjunction with Bawdeswell which depends on a volunteer taking bookings and being available to answer queries. The rate paid per mile is 45p. The Chairman asked if there is a guidance document available and Ms. Varney will provide this. Drivers are subject to various checks (police, medical, etc) and public liability insurance cover of £5M has to be in place.

Climate Positive Group

An item has been placed in Elmham News but, to date, there has not yet been a response. The Parish Council supports the project, in principle.

Guide Book To The Ruins Reprint

Dr Susanna Wade-Martins (PCC Secretary) had advised that the guide book to the ruins at the site of the Anglo-Saxon cathedral is coming to the end of its print run and the PCC would like to reprint it. The 2006 version was published by the Parish Council with a grant from English Heritage. It was felt necessary for English Heritage to be approached by the PCC to obtain their reaction to again providing financial support. Mr. Labouchere is to report back to Dr. Wade-Martins.

Report from District Councillor

Mr. Bambridge said attendance at SNAP meetings can assist in getting police to visit particular villages more frequently. Allocations are arranged to cover periods of three months. The CANT campaign is doing well with over 2,000 responses. The two main factors for the proposal to be opposed are environmental and infrastructure reasons. Mr.Bambridge said that he is pressing for a general meeting to be held in this area.



NEW COMMUNITY CAR SCHEME

At the suggestion of a parishioner, the Parish Council is hoping to set up a community car scheme. This service will provide transport to medical and dental appointments in local surgeries or hospitals for residents who would otherwise be unable to attend.

Anyone who holds a valid driving licence has the potential to be a voluntary driver. There is no general age restriction, but a declaration of good health would be required together with a valid MOT, tax and car insurance. They would also need to have a DBS check which will be arranged through a specialist company. Drivers will be paid at the government rate of 45p per mile but otherwise it is a not-for-profit scheme.

The scheme would need one coordinator and, ideally, up to 10 voluntary drivers. If you are interested in helping your community with such a scheme, either as a coordinator or a driver, please contact a member of the Parish Council (details at the back of the magazine) when more information will be provided.

BRECKLAND COUNCIL'S LOCAL PLAN

Consultation Open September/October 2023

In the Spring, Breckland Council carried out an "Issues and Options Consultation". There were thousands of responses. Now they are conducting a new consultation. Why is not clear – most questions are just "more of the same". However, we must ensure as many local residents as possible do respond, in order to outweigh the pressure that may well be applied by developers and their allies. So, please take 10 minutes to do the following:

- > Google BRECKLAND COMMONPLACE
- > Click on HAVE YOUR SAY
- Scroll down and click on one or both:
 DEVELOPMENT LOCATIONS ('growth across the district')

HOUSING: ISSUES AND NUMBERS ('new homes').

Read and then answer the questions. Put down whatever you think appropriate, but later in this piece, you will see how Campaign Against New Town will be responding. Our message is that we are in favour of affordable/social housing, but completely against large developments dumped on totally inappropriate rural areas, simply because those involved stand to make a lot of money.

Note that you must put in your email address at the foot of the page and complete your details at the end (these will not appear online).

The Council are intent on getting the views of more 'young people'; so, if you can encourage some to respond, even better!

If you have time, please do also answer the other sections on 'Protecting Valued Places', 'Natural Environment', 'Housing Type', 'Climate Change' and 'Transport'.

These are CANT's responses that you can use:

DEVELOPMENT LOCATIONS ('growth across the district')

Do you agree with the settlement hierarchy? YES.

- New housing must be located where there are existing services. And those services should be upgraded as required **before** development commences.
- Smaller towns and villages must not be swamped by speculative greenfield developments which only exist for the profit of developers and landowners.

HOUSING: issues and numbers

Do you think the target number of homes is right? YES.

- Obviously, we do need many more affordable homes for people starting on the property 'ladder'. But we don't need the big new estates that are being proposed that far exceed the region's natural population growth.
- Houses being built now are not selling. Current developments are being slowed down for a lack of demand, for example in North Elmham and Swanton Morley.
- We don't have a crisis of housing demand in Norfolk; we have an affordability crisis.
- The consultation document says that 8,000 houses have already been given planning permission or been allocated. However, in Breckland's Issues and Options paper, Appendix 1, permissions plus allocations are over 13,000. The lower figure has arisen because the council does not expect all 13,000 to be built in the next 25 years. The council needs to put pressure on the developers to build

Are there issues that may justify more than the target number? NO.

- Some will argue that many more homes are required to allow for a percentage of affordable homes, on the basis that developments are supposed to include 20%.
- Almost no recent developments achieved that 20% target. And when developers experience a slow-down, then it's the affordable section that will be cut first.- The only way to ensure the construction of more affordable homes is through projects that are either entirely, or majority, affordable.

Are there issues that may justify less than the target number? YES.

- There is minimal current demand outside of the affordable sector.
- Breckland Council will be coming under increasing pressure to allocate more homes, because of Natural England's restrictions relating to both nutrient neutrality and the stone curlew protection zone. There is the danger that, simply to reach their targets, Breckland will attempt to allocate sites that might otherwise seem inappropriate.

Do you agree that access to community services (public transport, jobs, health, schools and shops) is the most important consideration when choosing an area for housing growth? YES.

- But those key issues must be seen alongside the key environmental considerations.

And we would not agree if a developer claimed to provide those services in justification of a new settlement in an inappropriate location.

WIVES PLUS ALL

We held our monthly meeting on Thursday October 12th in the Memorial Hall, North Elmham when Emily Matthew came along to talk to members about the Dogs Trust which in Norfolk is based at Snetterton near Attleborough. The theme of Emily's illustrated talk was "The Dog's Trust Past, Present & Future".

Information on the internet tells us that Lady Gertrude Stock started the "National Canine Defence League" in 1891 and her small group vowed to campaign against Dog cruelty which then was very prevalent. In the decades that followed, the League continued to campaign for better dog welfare. It increased rehoming, survived 2 World Wars and worked with partners overseas. The League became the Dogs Trust in 2003 and it has celebrated

many successes, from helping to change laws such as the Dangerous Dog Act ,compulsory UK microchipping, launching The Freedom Project, which is a free dog fostering service to help people and their dogs escape domestic abuse, free veterinary treatment for the dogs of owners facing homelessness and the Dog Training School. The Dogs Trust policy to "Never destroy a healthy dog in its care" came into being in 1964 and the slogan "A dog is for life not just for Christmas" was created in 1978. However, when in the Pandemic Puppy sales rose and Rehoming enquiries increased this slogan was temporarily changed to "A dog is for life not just for lockdown"

The Dog's Trust is the UK's leading Animal Charity and one of their 21 UK Rehoming Centres has looked after around more than 14,000 dogs - more than any other animal welfare charities.

Donations by members of dog food, towels, blankets were received by Emily for the Snetterton Rehoming Centre and we thank Emily very much in deed for a very interesting talk to us.

The photo shows June Webb of Eastgate Street being given a CD of the request she sent to a radio station for her late mother Mrs Potter, also of Eastgate Street, over 50 years ago!

Having an unusual interest in old radio programmes and armed with my trusty tranny, I took the opportunity to tune into a repeat of a request show from an international offshore station which first went out in October 1972. This particular broadcast was special to me because I was acquainted with the DJ who later went on to present programmes on a legal radio station in Suffolk where I was a shareholder.

So here I was reliving my youth for old times' sake. About half-way through the programme, I began to think I had heard enough and was about to switch off when suddenly the DJ read out a picture postcard he had been sent of the Oasis Tower on Great Yarmouth seafront. It was asking him to play any Jim Reeves song for a Mrs Potter of Eastgate Street; he played 'He'll Have To Go'. Having a request played on a major station like that would have been a big deal by any standards. So ,what I had just listened to raised several questions because I did not know a Mrs Potter and, indeed, why should I some 50 years later?

That could have been the end of this little tale, but at this point village archivist Janet Woodhouse stepped in and readily donned her detective hat. As a result of some very diligent investigation, it emerged that it was June Webb and four members of her family (all of whom had their names read out) who had sent in the dedication request for their mother, Mrs

Potter, but who has since sadly passed away. June can still recall listening and hearing the music.

Happily, modern technology and clever ingenuity has allowed us to record those memorable moments onto a CD for June, so she and her family now have a permanent reminder of their claim to fame - a very lucky ending to a chance in a million. It makes me wonder how many other coincidences happen around the village that we never get to hear about.

ELMHAM WILDLIFE

I always ask you to get in touch with me if you find anything interesting and over the last month two of you have done just that. Firstly Joyce called me about a spider she had found while gardening. She was struck by the markings on the back of its rather large body (photo 1). Now I'm not an expert on spiders by any means, and although it reminded me on the common Garden Spider I was far from sure that this was its identity - it was bigger than the Garden Spiders I'm used to seeing. But I looked it up and discovered that it was indeed a Garden Spider, so not an unusual species, but an interesting find nonetheless. The markings on their back really are quite marvellous.

The other person to call me was Kathy. She had found a toadstool in her garden that wasn't familiar to her. I went along to have a look and it wasn't one that was familiar to me either (photo 2). After some research I narrowed it down to one of two species, Bluefoot Bolete (a newly described species that is common but was until recently confused with a different species) or Sepia Bolete. I plumped for Bluefoot, not least because Sepia Bolete is described as scarce or rare, and is supposed to be associated with deciduous trees whereas this was under two conifers and had pine needles clearly attached to the base of its stem. Fortunately I have a friend who is an expert at fungus identification and after sending him a few photos he informed me that it was in fact the other one, the scarcer Sepia Bolete.

Autumn is the best time of year to look for fungi, so I thought I might do this piece about fungi. But I realised that most of my best photos of fungi taken in North Elmham have already been used in these columns. So instead, inspired by Joyce's Garden Spider, I shall do it on arachnids. Autumn can also be a good time to see these.

Arachnids are not just another name for spiders – they are a larger group that

includes spiders, but also harvestmen, ticks, mites and pseudoscorpions (tiny almost microscopic scorpion-like creatures which I'd love to see but haven't done yet). They also include scorpions but those don't occur in North Elmham.

Harvestmen look quite similar to spiders. The main difference is that in spiders the head and body are distinct with a clear neck between them. With harvestmen, like the Common Harvestman (photo 3), the head and body appear as a single rounded blob. Typically harvestmen have long legs and a tiny body, but this can be the case with some spiders too. Another difference between harvestmen and spiders is that harvestmen don't produce silk. Rather than catching insects in webs, they stalk their prey as they walk through the vegetation.

Many people, including me sometimes, are scared of spiders, but the only arachnids in North Elmham that we have any good reason to fear are the tiny ticks. There are lots of different ticks, but the ones that are most likely to attach themselves to us are Sheep Ticks (sometimes called Deer Ticks, as deer are the main carrier round here). They can be hard to tell apart from other species that live on other animals but all those that I've identified having examined them under a microscope have been Sheep Ticks. Male and female Sheep Ticks look very different, and they also change appearance as they mature, and as the engorge themselves on blood. The red and black female is how I find them most often but the ones I've found attached to my skin (photo 4) have been smaller and brown. Some ticks carry Lyme Disease which is exceedingly unpleasant when passed on to humans. Friends who have had it tell me that they had to be quite persistent before it was formally diagnosed and they were given treatment. It's knocked them out for months and had lasting effects that have continued for much longer. It's important that it is treated quickly so check

yourself for ticks when you come in from wild places, especially if you've walked through long vegetation. Pull them off carefully, preferably using special tweezers designed for this purpose and get medical advice if you experience symptoms or have the characteristic bullseye ring rash. Fortunately none of my bites have resulted in any symptoms – most ticks either don't carry the disease or don't pass it on. So it's not something you need to worry about, and certainly not something that should put you off from getting out, but do be careful and get prompt treatment if you develop symptoms after a bite.

Mites don't have a great reputation either, but for no good reason. There are lots of different sorts of mites. Some live in the soil and are really useful, playing a key part in breaking down organic matter as well as providing food for slightly larger invertebrates. Many of these are microscopic, so tiny and fastmoving that I've not been very successful photographing them, but I've seen some amazingly colourful species. You are more likely to see Red Spider Mites (photo 5) which are a little bigger (though still very tiny) and are often found on surfaces rather than in the soil. They look like really tiny bright red spiders, though there are a number of very similar species.

Another type of mite often attach themselves to flying insects. Mites don't have wings, so hitchhiking on a winged insect is the best way to get about. Broadly speaking they don't do the insect any harm, although it's a bit more complicated than that – sometimes they can do a bit of harm and sometimes they can be a benefit to the carrier. Insects that are particularly prone to carrying mites are beetles that feed on carrion like the sexton beetles – sometimes they can be completely covered in the mites (photo 6).

Another group of mites are microscopically small and although the mites themselves are hard to spot, you can tell they are present by galls that





are produced on the plants they live on. Chemicals produced by the mites cause the plant to grow abnormally producing some tissue that provides a safe place for the mites to live. There are many different sorts of galls (not all of which are caused by mites - others are caused by flies, wasps or fungi for example) but some can be quite easy to find. A good example are the galls caused by the Maple Gall Mite. You can see these on Field Maple leaves, often clustered in large numbers. They are tiny reddish pustules protruding up from the upper surface of the leaf (photo 7). There are similar galls caused by different species of mite on sycamore trees and lime trees, among others.

Spiders are the best-known arachnids and although I'm not their biggest fan, I do appreciate some of them. Actually I appreciate all of them, I just don't always like them! Here are some I do like...

Firstly one of our most spectacular species, and a new arrival in North

Elmham. Wasp Spider was restricted to southern England but is spreading north and has recently colonised Norfolk. This year was a particularly good one for them and I've heard of far more in the Wensum Valley than ever before, including one which a friend pointed out to me inside the North Elmham parish near Bintree Mill (photo 8). Have you seen one here yet?

I think it's fairly obvious where the Wasp Spider gets its name and the same can be said for the Zebra Spider (photo 9). A much smaller squatter spider it's one of a small handful of spiders that I think can fairly be described as cute (though I suspect some of you may disagree). They're one of a family of jumping spiders, and can often be found on walls and fenceposts, as well as coming indoors sometimes

I'll finish with another spider that I most often see indoors. In fact the one here (photo 10) was photographed in my study while I was writing this. It's a Longbodied Cellar Spider, sometimes known as Daddy Long-legs Spider (but not to be confused with craneflies which are also commonly known as Daddy Long-legs). Cellar spiders are thought to have been accidentally introduced to Britain with wine imports from Europe. One of the reasons I like them is that they're very effective predators of other household pests including other spiders. I think they must do so when the lights are out because I never see them at it.

Thanks again to those of you who have been in touch with your sightings. There's always lots to see around the parish or in your gardens if you take the time to walk slowly and stop frequently to look and listen. If you have anything interesting to share please contact me:






