DID YOU KNOW.....?

- We used to have a Chess Club which met in the school. In 1982 the Club had a membership of 15 Juniors and 10 adult players and you could belong for the princely sum of 50p for children or £1 for adults. Secretary Mrs Elizabeth Chilvers said the club catered for players of any age or standard.
- Stephen Earle, the son of our village doctor, had been chosen to represent the British Team in the World Winter Games for the Deaf to be held in Madonna di Campiglio. He didn't discover skiing until 1977 when he went on a winter holiday with Elmham Young Farmers. By 1980 he was on the championship trail representing Britain in the European Deaf Ski Championships in March and winning the British Ski Championships for the Deaf at Aviemore two months later.
- Mrs Jennifer Clarke who had a restaurant at Nelsons, past the church towards Guist, was flooded for the second time in two months.
 - Station Officer Les Thompson, from Dereham Fire Station, who took charge at the scene said: 'It's really bad. The building flooded quickly. I've never seen hailstones so big. They are over half an inch across'.

Mrs Clarke said 'God knows what the insurance company will say. They haven't finished with the first claim yet'.

PAM NEVE

Pamela Neve of Cathedral Drive sadly died on August 26th 2022, with close members of her family at her side.

Pam led a full and happy life. She was in the crowds in Pall Mall for the wedding of Princess Elizabeth to Philip, in 1947. And again, for the Queen's Coronation in 1952, with her fiancé Reg. Pam married the love of her life in 1953. They used to holiday and help out on the Kings Head farm, run at that time by Reggie's uncle Olly Smith, helping to bring in the harvest with a horse and cart. They moved in 1962 from London to Blackburn House, Holt Road, and the three daughters went to the local primary school.

Pam was always a hard worker, a homedecorator, an adaptable person, willing to put in the hours to contribute to the family finances, and to make do and mend when things were tight. She worked the land bringing in the seasonal fruit on Don's estate, kept holiday cottages at Eccles, as well as working at the village post office and grocery store.

Eventually Reg & Pam bought the post office and shop premises from Beryl and Arthur Woods to become the local postmaster and mistress. These were perhaps some of their happiest years and she loved being at the heart of village life. They were particularly friendly with Janet and Dave Sinclair the local butchers, enjoying homemade wine parties and foreign holidays.

Pam was known for being involved with several village activities over many years: including Short Mat Bowling, Elmham Players, Cub Scouts, WI, Horticultural Society, and as Treasurer for the Memorial Hall, always helping wherever needed. Pam was indeed a founder-member of, and made costumes for, the Elmham Players' pantos, plays and shows. Their huge attic at Sans Souci in Station Road overflowed with costumes, scenery, and



props. She just loved being a part of something, seeing people and catching up on the news.

She was very creative: an exceptional dressmaker, making many wedding dresses, bridesmaids dresses and even knitted dresses and soft furnishings; she also loved upholstery and reupholstered many pieces of furniture. She made silver jewellery, and dabbled in oil painting, decoupage, and every other craft that the WI group could imagine, she would have a go at.

Pam was a popular character in the village and was always happy to be invited for a day out or for lunch at the Head or the Slip with her many friends. She liked to watch the village children from her window as they went to and from school, how they walked with their childminder each holding onto the rope that kept them together. Her conversation would always stop as she watched them cross the road. She loved her view down Cathedral Drive and visitors often caught her looking passed them at something that caught her eye in the neighbourhood. She always maintained a lively interest

Struggling through her grief, she managed to keep busy seeing her family and friends. Village dog-walkers will remember her with the lovely "Ace", the black and white cocker, he was a such special part of her widowhood, and she was so sad when he had to leave her earlier this year due to his illnesses brought on by diabetes

It was just after Ace died that Pam herself became quite ill and she hated being ill. It stopped her doing things she wanted to do. She had planned her various 90th birthday parties for her family and dear friends, but unfortunately the parties never happened as she spent her actual birthday in A&E, where the NHS staff treated her right regally. Her illness was terminal, but she fought it like the warrior she was, and death wasn't going to win without a bloody good fight. The family expected no less from her and are so proud of her.

Robert Kerrison came to North Elmham in 1890, from Tittleshall, to run the Village Store and Post Office at Holt Road. The descendants of Robert recently met up in Elmham and enjoyed a party at the Store - now Elmham Tea Post. The venue was picked for the 75th Birthday celebrations for Dr Rebecca Spearot. Beccy was the third great grandchild of Robert. She had lived her very early years with her Mum and Dad at Windfall Cottage next to the Stores. Beccy went to Dereham High School and then onwards to the University of Michigan where she met her husband, Jim Spearot. They currently live in Colorado. Beccy's youngest son Alan, who lives in California, was also able to attend the party. Other great grandchildren at the party were Sue Johnson and Di Dann, daughters of George and Molly Kerrison., and Esmond and Ruth Edwards children of Tommy and Joan Edwards. George and Joan were the children of Frank and Agnes Kerrison who ran the Stores after Robert. Also, able to join the party were Kim and Jacquie Johnson from Perth in Western Australia.

Cousins Es and Ruth gave a brief summary of the family association with the Stores, now the Tea Post. Di was able to add that she was the only family member left living in the area. She had many happy memories of her early years spent at the Stores including filling the empty bottles brought in by villagers for re-fills from the oak barrels of sherry, port and apricot wine. The Stores had everything! Thanks were given to Ben, Paul and Anne for providing a delicious supper.



Children are loving their new classroom!

Class News

Sheep: Sheep class have had a wonderful first week in their new classroom! Our Year 1 and 2 children have been fantastic, helping to settle in our new Reception starters. We have been busy getting to know the new routines and developing relationships with children and adults in class. This term we will be thinking about ourselves: our likes and dislikes. our similarities and differences. NORTH ELMHAM WILDLIFE

Perhaps the most extraordinary event of 2022 in the Lepidopteran world (butterflies and moths, that is) related to a tiny (about 3/4 cm long) mottled brown moth called a Beet Moth (photo 1). Beet Moths live on the saltmarshes and shingle coasts of southern Britain where their caterpillars feed mainly on Sea Beet leaves. At least that's how it used to be. In 2019 a friend found one near North Walsham - Norfolk's first ever record. Then there were four more records in Norfolk in each of 2020 and 2021, mostly at inland locations well away from where Sea Beet grows. I found my first here in May of this year, the tenth record for Norfolk, followed by lots more over the summer. One night I counted 209 of the little moths in my moth trap, making up well over half of all the moths of any species that I caught that night. My experience was mirrored by other moth trappers around the county and, to a lesser extent, elsewhere in the country. What caused this sudden population explosion? Well, it seems that as well as Sea Beet, the caterpillars are now content to chomp the leaves of Sugar Beet (which may explain why so many in Norfolk in particular, Norfolk being in the country's main Sugar Beet growing region) and also of Chard and Beetroot. It has been speculated that they may also now be feeding on some other closelyrelated plants which grow prolifically in newly-dried up wetlands, and which may have therefore had a good year in this summer's drought. Whatever the cause, it's got to be one of the most dramatic and rapid colonisation events that I've ever witnessed

Most of the moths we see here are resident species – in other words they spend their whole life cycle in roughly the same place. But many species of moth migrate and visitors from overseas

sometimes appear here. It's been a good summer for migrant moths, although I never seem to catch as many here as some people do elsewhere in the county. One very distinctive migrant moth that turned up here two nights running is called a Vestal. Nothing to do with the Roman goddess Vesta or her vestal virgins (though presumably whoever named the moth must have imagined a likeness) this moth is plain yellow with an obvious dark pink or brown stripe across the wings (photo 2), and they travel here from southern Europe or even Africa.

Plume moths are strange moths with long, thin, often feathery wings held out at right angles from the body. There are a few species, some common, others much less so. The Breckland Plume is mainly known from the Norfolk and Suffolk Brecks and a few other similarly sandy habitats in southern England. It seems to be spreading in Norfolk and I caught two in my garden this year for the first time (photo 3). Other nice moths found during the past month have included Canary-shouldered Thorn (photo 4), Lilac Beauty (photo 5) and Antler Moth (photo 6).

I came home from work one day recently to find a pot on my doorstep with a note from Julia W. In the pot were some plum leaves and a pale yellow furry caterpillar with a tuft of shocking-pink hairs protruding from its back (photo 7). Julia had found it on a plum tree and thought I might be interested – which I was! It was a Pale Tussock. The adult moths turn up in my moth trap regularly - quite large greyish moths with very furry front legs which they sprawl out in front of them when resting, but I don't see their caterpillars very often. This one hadn't eaten the plum leaves and wasn't interested in various other leaves I offered it, so I guessed it was ready to pupate and let it go to find somewhere safe to do so.

One day recently when I was walking along the railway I noticed a small ladybird tucked into the base of a sowthistle leaf. It had seven spots on the wing cases like the common 7-spot Ladybird but it was smaller, had a different pattern on its foreparts and the spots were positioned further back. It was an Adonis Ladybird – only the second I've ever seen (photo 8). A few minutes later I spotted two shieldbugs. At first I thought they were Red-legged Shieldbugs which I see a lot, but looking closer I realised that these had long sharply-pointed projections sticking out to the side behind their necks. They were a species I have been keeping an eye out for but had never previously come across - Spiked Shieldbug (photo 9).

Swallows congregate in the late summer before heading off on their long journey south to sub-Saharan Africa. At such times there is often a flock at the bottom of the Cathedral Meadows and I enjoyed watching these recently. Every now and then an adult (recognised by its brighter colours and longer tail streamers) would feed a juvenile mid-flight. I realised I could predict when this interaction was about to happen by a particular call type that they were making, but it always happened in a different place and each time it was over so quickly I never managed to get any footage of it happening. I did manage a few photos of the adults flying alone (photo 10) and the juveniles on the fence wires (photo 11).

JACK LAST (PART 2)

Here is another piece about Jack Last's very busy life – taken from his book 'Life and Thoughts of a Countryman.'

I realise that Jack was born in 1915 and his life was very different to most village children's way of living. They probably all helped at harvest time with odd jobs on the farms but Jack's life was dictated by his father's working life as Gamekeeper here in Elmham. Jack's love of the job shines through in his writing.

Twelve Years Old and Jobs with Father

At twelve years almost grown up. He made rabbit snares, could load cartridges and make purse nets and long nets. Then in the Winter, on Saturdays he was taught how to use the nets – and use ferrets too.

He was bitten by the ferrets... and rats!

Jack said that a screaming rabbit would bite you if you happen to put your hand near its mouth... and that's worse than a ferret or rat bite! If the bite turned septic it was poulticed with a bread poultice (bread broken on a saucer and hot water added. Surplus water was squeezed out, the bread put onto a rag and placed over the wound and left till morning). Then some ointment was put on the wound maybe Boric ointment or Vaseline.

It wasn't always just work. Once a year there was a Flower and Vegetable Show on the Park. A big tent as well as small ones were put up and there was a display by the Watts Naval boys. There was also a fair, just inside the lodge gate in front of the church. Simple pleasures for village folk.

Jack said at Christmas time he and his siblings had a present each and a few nuts, sweets and an orange. His Father's Boss always gave them some 'good toys'

at Christmas and Mr Probyn who lived at the Hollies (opposite the present Vicarage) gave the family a hamper of fruit.

In the summer there was always a Sunday School Fete and tea. I assume this was held at the Vicarage home of the Reverend Townsend.

Once a year the family went to the seaside – strange I thought, with two railway stations in the Parish they could have gone more than once in different directions to the sea but perhaps the cost of tickets for a family was prohibitive and they couldn't afford it.

He did buy himself a bike from the Head Master's wife for twelve shillings (60 pence today). He was the only boy in the village to have a bike!

One thing he said he did enjoy – playing in the ponds on the estate. Many of those same ponds have now been filled in and also playing on the lake if it froze over.

On Monday mornings he would collect money from houses for clothes for their families at Harvest holiday time. The Head Master took the money and banked it. Then vouchers were issued to people and they could go shopping in Dereham or Fakenham and buy clothes for the winter.

On Tuesday morning he collected money for the Hospital Association of St Giles Street in Norwich. This was 1 penny a week for single people and 2 pence for married people. This covered their children as well. Can you imagine allowing a child to do this today!

More another time. It was a hard life and a gamekeeper was expected to be on his toes and make sure there was always plenty of game for shooting parties.






