GUIDELINES

The aim of our show is for people to come together to celebrate their hobbies and have fun. The following guidelines are designed to give structure to the show, support the very difficult task of judging and give exhibitors an idea of what the judges are looking for.

- ♦ Maximum of two entries per class per exhibitor.
- ♦ All exhibits must be staged by 10.45am, a bell will ring to signify for exhibitors to clear the hall.
- ♦ No exhibitor may move or otherwise interfere with another exhibits. Exhibits may only be moved by a designated official.
- ♦ Any exhibits not removed from display will be sold at the end of the Show, with proceeds to Club funds.
- ♦ When comparing exhibits judges consider condition, uniformity, size, shape and colour.
- ♦ Judges decision is final, complaints and comments will be recorded by Club Officials and addressed in relation to future shows.
- ♦ No responsibility can be accepted for damage to exhibits, containers, or any loss regardless of cause.

POINTS

Points are awarded in each class accordingly:

1st place = 5 points ❖ 2nd place = 2 points ❖ 3rd place = 1 point ❖ Best in Show = 5 bonus points.
Best of the Best in Show = 5 bonus points

TROPHY & CUP WINNERS

Cups are held by the winners for 11 months and remain the property of North Elmham Gardening Club. They must be returned in a clean and undamaged condition to the Gardening Club Chairman in July 2026. Non-members awarded a cup will need to provide proof of identity and provide an email address and verified mobile number. All cup holders must inform the Chairman if they change their address or if cups/trophies are lost or damaged.

All entries must be home grown by the exhibitor. Unless stated in the schedule classes requiring more than one vegetable should be of the same variety and similar in size. Individual tomatoes should be displayed with a calyx. Beans should be displayed with some stalk intact.

RECIPE 2025: CLASS NO. 50

INGREDIENTS

Cake

225g self raising flour
1 level tsp baking powder
150g brown sugar
50g walnuts (chopped)
100g carrots (washed, trimmed & coarsely grated)
2x large eggs
150ml sunflower oil

Topping

50g butter (softened)
50g full fat cream cheese
150g icing sugar (sifted)
1/2 tsp vanilla extract

METHOD

Preheat the oven to 180°C / fan 160°C / gas mark 4.

Grease a 20cm deep cake tin and line with non-stick baking paper.

In a large mixing bowl sift together the flour and baking powder and stir in the sugar.

Add the chopped nuts and grated carrots and mix lightly.

Make a well in the centre, add the eggs and oil and beat until it is mixed thoroughly.

Pour the mix into 20cm deep cake tin the cake tin and place in the preheated oven for around 1 1/4 hours, or until golden brown and shrinking from the sides of the tin.

Using a skewer, insert it in the centre of the cake, if it is thoroughly cooked, the skewer should come out clean.

Once baked turn out the sponge, remove the baking paper and leave to cool on a wire rack.

To creating the topping...

Place all your ingredients into a bowl and whisk thoroughly with an electric mixer/hand mixer.

Spread evenly over the cake using a palette knife or back of a spoon.

Sprinkle any left over walnuts to decorate.
